11. Othercomments: Several bills addressing proof of identity, lawfu lpresenceandVirginia residencyintheapplicationprocessforDMVdocuments/credentialshavebeenintroduced. HB638andseveralothersimilarbillsrequiringin -personapplication could potentially impact customerservicelevelsatDMVbyincreasingth enumberofapplicantsvisitingcustomerservice centersduetothetemporaryelimination(forapproximately5years)ofalternativerenewal methods(internet,mail,touch -tone). Inaddition, the increased complexity of DMV document/credentialtransaction sthatwouldresultfromthislegislationcouldimpactDMV's customerservicelevels. Depending upon the outcome of this effort and any legislation that may result,DMV may require additional staffing in order to accommodate revision sto, and new requirements in, the application process, in which case this FIS will require revision. This legislationmayhaveanadverseimpactuponthechildspecialidentificationcardprogramat DMV, if proof of residency is required for the very young. DMV may no longer beabletoissue this group of identification cards because children would not be able to provere sidency and parentswouldnotbeabletocertifytotheresidencyofthechild. Thelossofrevenuereceivedby DMVforissuanceofchildidentificationcar dscouldbeupto\$121,000annually.
