It provides that property owners with structures or property inclear and imminent dan gerfrom erosion and storm drainages hall be allowed to erect protective bulk heads or other equivalent structural improvements as approved by the Virginia Beach Wetlands Board. The bill also requires that the applicant consent in writing to the future con struction of bulk heads tying into the applicant's bulk head from adjacent properties. | 8. | Fiscalimplications: The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) has indicated to the Department of Environmental Quality and the Marine Resources Commission that passage of this legislation will necessitate are view of Virginia's Coastal Zone Management Program by NOAA. If it is determined that the change has a significant negative impact on the Commonwealth's Sand Dune Management efforts, NOAA may reallocate funds currently provided for the Marine Resources Commission's programs to ward other coastal management programs in Virginia. However, the total funding to Virginia would remain unchanged. Through conversation with NOAA, the Marine Resources Commission estimates that any reallocation from the Marine Resources Commission to other Virginia programs may be one to two percent of the \$150,000 that the Marine Resources Commission receives through the Coastal Zone Management Program. | | | | |
