### 8. Fiscalimplications:

CurrentpolicypermitsparentsorlegalguardianstofileapplicationsforMedicaidorFAMISon behalfofachild.Furthermore,pa rentsorlegalguardiansareallowedtodesignateanauthorized representativetoactontheirbehalfandfileanapplicationforachild.Ifthisbillpasses,itwould allowcaretakers,whoarenotsolecustodians,legalguardians,orauthorizedrepresen tativesto applyforMedicaidorFAMISonbehalfofachild.

#### Administrative and Support Services and FAMISP lan Administration

The Department of Medical Assistance Services (DMAS) estimates that it will incurable it on a claim sprocessing costs because of the additional claims being paid for the new enrollees in both the Medicaid program and the FAMIS Plan. The agency estimates that additional claims processing expenses for the new Medicaid recipients will be \$4,479(\$1,185GF) in FY 2003 and \$13,309(\\$3,327GF) in FY 2004. Regarding the additional FAMIS claims, DMAS estimates that the processing expenses will be \$688(\\$238GF) in FY 2003 and \$1,932(\\$669GF) in FY 2004.

#### FAMISPlanPaymentsandMedicalAssistanceServices(Medicaid)

WhileDMASbelievesth atthisbillwouldincreasethenumberofchildrenenrolledinMedicaid andFAMIS,itadmitsthatestimatingtheactualnumberwouldbedifficult.Censusdataestimates thatnationwide,approximately2.6millionchildren(fourpercentofallchildren)liv ein householdswithnoparent.Childrenlivinginfostercare,whoarealreadyMedicaideligible, accountfor313,000ofthesechildren.Thisleavesapproximately2.3millionchildreninother householdswithoutparents.Virginia'spopulationisapprox imatelytwopercentofthetotal nation's,whichtranslatesintoapproximately45,740children.

AlthoughmanychildreninVirginiamayhaveparentsorlegalguardians,thepercentageof childrenlivinginornearpovertywithoutparentsissubstantiallyh igherthantheoverallaverage. InorderforDMAStoadjustitsestimatetoaccountforthefactthatmanychildrenhavelegal guardiansorarestillincontactwithatleastoneparent,ithasreduceditsestimatedpopulationof childrenaffectedbythis billbyapproximately75percentto11,435.Currently,approximately

14.11 percentof Virginia's children are enrolled in the Medicai diprogramand 2.05 percentare enrolled in the FAMIS Plan. DMAS has applied these percentages to the estimated populatio 11,435 to determine that an additional 1,613 children would enroll in Medicai dand 234 would enroll in FAMIS because of this bill.

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Previous experience with eligibility expansion or adjustment shas shown DMAS that increases in enrollment resulting from such changes occur over time. Therefore, DMAS assumes in its estimates that it will take approximately a year and a half for increases in enrollment for both of these programs to fully phase in.

Theagencyestimatesthatthecostforbothprogramsis \$128permonthinFY2003and\$139per monthinFY2004.DMASsaysthatthecostsareessentiallythesamebecausetheagencyis assumingthesamehealthstatusanddemographicsforbothpopulations. Applyingthese assumptions, DMASbelievesthatMedica idmedicalexpendituresresultingfromthisbillwillbe \$894,629(\$442,419GF)inFY2003andapproximately\$2.5million(\$1.2millionGF)inFY 2004. RegardingtheincreasedenrollmentintheFAMISprogram, DMASestimatesthatthecost willbe\$129,903 (\$44,922GF)inFY2003and\$364,620(\$126,268GF)inFY2004.
