#### 8. Fiscalimplications:

Currentpolicypermitsparentsorlegalguardi anstofileapplicationsforFAMISonbehalfofa child.Furthermore,parentsorlegalguardiansareallowedtodesignateanauthorized representativetoactontheirbehalfandfileanapplicationforachild.Thisbillwillallow caretakerrelatives,w hoarenotsolecustodians,legalguardians,orauthorizedrepresentatives,to applyforFAMISonbehalfofachild.

Censusdataestimatesthatnationwide,approximately2.6millionchildren(fourpercentofall children)liveinhouseholdswithnoparent .Childrenlivinginfostercare,whoarealready Medicaideligible,accountfor313,000ofthesechildren,withasimilarnumberlivingwithnon relativesorbythemselves.Thisleavesapproximately1.97millionchildreninotherhouseholds withoutpare nts.Virginia'spopulationisapproximatelytwopercentofthetotalnation's,which translatesintoapproximately39,480children.

AlthoughmanychildreninVirginiamayhaveparentsorlegalguardians,thepercentageof childrenlivinginornearpover tywithoutparentsissubstantiallyhigherthantheoverallaverage. InorderforDMAStoadjustitsestimatetoaccountforthefactthatmanychildrenhavelegal guardiansorarestillincontactwithatleastoneparent,ithasreduceditsestimatedpo pulationof childrenaffectedbythisbillbyapproximately75percentto9,870.Currently,approximately2.05 percentofVirginia'schildrenareenrolledintheFAMISPlan.DMAShasappliedthispercentage totheestimatedpopulationof9,870todetermi nethatanadditional234childrenshouldenrollin FAMISbecauseofthisbill.

Previous experience with eligibility expansion or adjustment shas shown DMAS that increases in enrollment resulting from such changes occur over time. Therefore, DMAS assumes in its estimates that it will take approximately a year and a half for increases in enrollment to fully phase in.

Theestimatedcostfortheprogramis\$128permonthinFY2003and\$139permonthinFY2004.Thisresultsinincreasedexpendituresin theFAMISprogramof\$112,124(\$38,774GF)inFY2003and\$314,718(\$108,987GF)inFY2004.
