Currentpolicypermitsparentsorlegalguardianstof ileapplicationsforFAMISonbehalfofa child.Furthermore,parentsorlegalguardiansareallowedtodesignateanauthorized representativetoactontheirbehalfandfileanapplicationforachild.Ifthisbillpasses,itwould allowcaretakerrelat ives,whoarenotsolecustodians,legalguardians,orauthorized representatives,toapplyforFAMISonbehalfofachild.

WhileDMASbelievesthatthisbillwouldincreasethenumberofchildrenenrolledinFAMIS,it admitsthatestimatingtheactualnu mberwouldbedifficult.Censusdataestimatesthat nationwide,approximately2.6millionchildren(fourpercentofallchildren)liveinhouseholds withnoparent.Childrenlivinginfostercare,whoarealreadyMedicaideligible,accountfor 313,000of thesechildren,withasimilarnumberlivingwithnon -relativesorbythemselves.This leavesapproximately1.97millionchildreninotherhouseholdswithoutparents.Virginia's populationisapproximatelytwopercentofthetotalnation's,whichtransl atesintoapproximately 39,480children.

AlthoughmanychildreninVirginiamayhaveparentsorlegalguardians,thepercentageof childrenlivinginornearpovertywithoutparentsissubstantiallyhigherthantheoverallaverage. InorderforDMAStoa djustitsestimatetoaccountforthefactthatmanychildrenhavelegal guardiansorarestillincontactwithatleastoneparent,ithasreduceditsestimatedpopulationof childrenaffectedbythisbillbyapproximately75percentto9,870.Currently, approximately2.05 percentofVirginia'schildrenareenrolledintheFAMISPlan.DMAShasappliedthispercentage totheestimatedpopulationof9,870todeterminethatanadditional234childrenwouldenrollin FAMISbecauseofthisbill.

Previousexp eriencewitheligibilityexpansionoradjustmentshasshownDMASthatincreasesin enrollmentresultingfromsuchchangesoccurovertime.Therefore,DMASassumesinits estimatesthatitwilltakeapproximatelyayearandahalfforincreasesinenrollme nttofully phasein.

Theagencyestimatesthatthecostfortheprogramis\$128permonthinFY2003and\$139per monthinFY2004.ThisresultsinincreasedexpendituresintheFAMISprogramof\$112,124 (\$38,774GF)inFY2003and\$314,718(\$108,987 GF)inFY2004.
