- 8. Fiscalimplications: Thisbillwould requiretheDepartmentofMotorVehicles(DMV)to collectanadditionaltwo -dollarsurchargeonallmotorvehicleregistrations, effectiveJuly1, 2002(statefiscalyear2003). This, inturn, wouldallowDMV to increase its annual collections by an estimated\$10,400,000, which would be transferred to the Virginia Department of Health(VDH) per Section 46.2 -694 of the Code of Virginia for the provision of Emergency Medical Services (see other comments -item#11 for additional details). DMV estimates that it would incur minimal expenses for programming costs associated with the implementation of this legislation, while VDH would require a dequate nongeneral fund (NGF) appropriation beginning in FY2003 to expend this additional revenue.

- **11. Othercomments:** Thisbillproposestoincreasetherevenueearmarkedforthestatewide emergencymedicalser vicesprogram. Theincreasedrevenuewouldbedistributedtospecific programs, organizations and all jurisdictions in accordance to percentages specified in Section 46.2-694, *Code of Virginia*, as follows:
 - ♦ VirginiaAssociationofVolunteerRescueSquads (2.50%) Atradeorganizationthat provides rescuetraining (example: emergency vehicle operation, swiftwater rescue, etc.)
 - ◆ ImproveEmergencyMedicalServices(13.50%) —AdministeredbyVDH,whichsupports emergencymedicalservicesandadvancedlifesup porttraining,andEMSrecruitmentand retentionprograms(allfundsforsuchsupportshallbeusedtorecruitandretainvolunteer EMSpersonnelonly,includingpublicawarenesscampaigns,technicalassistance programsandsimilaractivities).
 - ◆ Statesuppo rtfortheVDHOfficeofEMS(17.25%) —StatewideEMSprogramsupport andotherEMSprogramsincludingtraumaregistrysupport,etc.
 - ◆ RegionalEMSCouncilSupportandStatePoliceFunding(10.0%)
 - ◆ RescueSquadAssistanceFund(31.75%) –Non -profitEMSagenci esincludingvolunteer fireandrescueorganizationscanreceivefundingforequipmentthroughmatchinggrants.
 - ♦ ReturntoLocalities(25.0%) —Providesfundingfortrainingofvolunteerorsalaried emergencymedicalservicepersonneloflicensed,nonprofit emergencymedicalservices agenciesandforthepurchaseofnecessaryequipmentandsuppliesforuseinsuchlocality forsuchagenciesandEMSservices.Fundingforvolunteerfireandrescuesquadsarealso providedinthispercentage.
