- 8. Fiscalimplications: Thisbill wouldrequiretheDepartmentofMotorVehicles(DMV)to collectanadditionaltwo -dollarsurchargeonallmotorvehicleregistrations,effectiveJuly1, 2002(statefiscalyear2003). This,inturn,wouldallowDMVtoincreaseitsannual collectionsbya nestimated\$13.0millioninFY2003and\$13.3millioninFY2004,which wouldbetransferredtotheVirginiaDepartmentofHealth(VDH)per\$46.2 -694ofthe Code ofVirginia fortheprovisionofEmergencyMedicalServices(seeothercomments -item#11 foradditionaldetails). DMVestimatesthatitwouldincurminimalexpensesforprogramming costsassociatedwiththeimplementationofthislegislation, while VDH would require adequatenongeneral fund(NGF) appropriation beginning in FY2003 to expend this additional revenue.

- **11. Othercomments:** Thisbillproposestoincreasetherevenueearmark edforthestatewide emergencymedicalservicesprogram. Theincreasedrevenuewouldbedistributedtospecific programs, organizations and all jurisdictions in accordance to percentages specified in Section 46.2-694, *Code of Virginia*, as follows:
  - ◆ VirginiaAssociationofVolunteerRescueSquads(2.50%) —Atradeorganizationthat providesrescuetraining(example:emergencyvehicleoperation,swiftwaterrescue,etc.)
  - ◆ ImproveEmergencyMedicalServices(13.50%) —AdministeredbyVDH,whichsupports emergencymedicalservicesandadvancedlifesupporttraining,andEMSrecruitmentand retentionprograms(allfundsforsuchsupportshallbeusedtorecruitandretainvolunteer EMSpersonnelonly,includingpublicawarenesscampaigns,technicalassistance programsandsimilaractivities).
  - ◆ StatesupportfortheVDHOfficeofEMS(17.25%) —StatewideEMSprogramsupport andotherEMSprogramsincludingtraumaregistrysupport,etc.
  - RegionalEMSCouncilSupportandStatePoliceFunding(10.0%)
  - ♦ RescueSquadAssist anceFund(31.75%) —Non -profitEMSagenciesincludingvolunteer fireandrescueorganizationscanreceivefundingforequipmentthroughmatchinggrants.
  - ♦ ReturntoLocalities(25.0%) —Providesfundingfortrainingofvolunteerorsalaried emergencymedical servicepersonneloflicensed,nonprofitemergencymedical services agencies and forthe purchase of necessary equipmentand supplies for use in such locality for such agencies and EMS services. Funding for volunteer fire and rescues quads are also provided in this percentage.
