4. Title Violationscommittedatrailroad/highwaygradecrossings.

**5.** Summary/Purpose: This legislation proposes to a mend §46.2 -505 of the Code of Virginia, andtoamendtheCodeofVirginiabyaddingsectionsnumbered46.2 -341.18:1,46.2 -341.20:1, and 46.2 -341.20:2, to provide for the disqualification of a person holding a commercialdriver'sli censeforcertainalcohol -relatedoffensescommittedinotherstates wheredisqualificationwasimposedthroughaciviloradministrativehearingwithoutany courtproceedings. The bill further provides for disqualification of a commercial driver's licenseholderfor60daysforviolationscommittedatrailroad/highwaygradecrossings. Longerdisqualifications are authorized for repeat of fenses. In addition, it authorizes the impositionofcivilpenaltiesupto\$10,000foremployerswhoalloworrequire anemployeeto operateacommercialmotorvehicleinviolationofanylaworregulationpertainingto railroad/highwaygradecrossingsandprovidesthatnocourtmayreduce, dismiss, or defer the convictionofapersonchargedwithanyoffensecommittedwh ileoperatingacommercial motorvehiclebecausethepersonhasattendedadriverimprovementclinic.

8. Fiscalimplications: Thefiscalimpactofthislegislat ioncouldbesignificant. The DepartmentofMotorVehicles(DMV)advisesthatt hisproposalwillputVirginiain compliancewithfederalcommercialdriver'slicenses(CDL)statutesandregulations. It furtheradvisesthat noncompliancewithsuchfederal lawsmayresultinVirginiabeingdenied theabilitytoissueCDLs, and will result in the loss of, not the transferof(i) federal highway funds in the amounts of 5% (or \$20.7 million) the first fiscal year and 10% (or \$41.4 million) each fiscal year ther eafter, and (ii) an unknown amount, possibly up to 50% (or approximately \$1.8 million), of Motor CarrierSafetyAssistanceProgram (MCSAP) funds allocated to the Virginia StatePolice.

Inaddition,thelegislationcallsforcivilpenaltiesofupto\$10, 000foremployerswhoallow orrequireanemployeetooperateacommercialmotorvehicleinviolationofanylawor regulationpertainingtorailroad/highwaygradecrossings.Itfurtherstipulatesthatnocourt mayreduce,dismiss,ordefertheconviction of apersonchargedwithanyoffensecommitted whileoperatingacommercialmotorvehiclebecausethepersonhasattendedadriver improvementclinic.Thesepenaltiescouldbeviewedasanadditionalsourceofrevenuefor theTransportationTrustFund,t houghnoestimateisavailableregardingthepotentialamount thatmaybecollected.
