4. Title Burning an object with intent to intimidate

5. Summary/Purpose:

Currently, it is a Class 6 felony to burn across so n the property of another, a highway, or other public place with the intent to intimidate any person or group. The proposed legislation would create an additional offense, making it a Class 6 felony to burn an object on the private property of another with the intent of intimidating another person or group of persons. It would also be a Class 6 felony to burn an object on a highway or other public place with the intent of intimidating any person or group of persons.

7. Budget amendment necessary: None.

8. Fiscal implications:

The proposed legislation could result in additional persons being incarcerated in state prisons. However, due to the lack of data, the Virginia Criminal Sentencing Commission has determined, pursuant to § 30-19.1:4 of the Code of Virginia, that the impact of the proposed legislation on state -responsible (prison) bed space cannot be quantified.
