Prohibitionagainsttheissuanceofspecialidentificationcardstopers onsthatholdanother DMVcredentialwillresultinanannualrevenuelossofapproximately\$451,027.

Theprohibitionagainstnon -Virginiaaddressesonthefaceofadriver'slicense,commercial driver'slicenseorspecialidentificationcardcouldresul tinthenon -renewalofallorsomeof thesecredentials. Itisnotclearwhetherallpersonswhocurrentlyhavenon -Virginia addressesdisplayedonDMVcredentialswouldbeunabletoprovideDMVwithabonafide Virginiaaddress. AssumingthatallDMVc redentialscurrentlyissuedwithnon -Virginia addressescouldnotberenewed, DMVwouldloseapproximately\$271,844inrevenues, while the Department of Education (which receives \$1.50 for every license is sued by DMV) would lose approximately \$28,690 inre venues, annually.
