5. Summary/Purpose: Thislegislation proposes to a mendandre enact§§9.1 -101,9- 1.102,9.1-110,9.1-184,15.2-1737,and19.2 -13oftheCodeofVirginia,andtoaddasectionnumbered 22.1-280.2:1. This bill defines a school resource of ficer as a trained, certified law enforcementofficerhiredbyalocallaw -enforcementagencytoprovidelaw -enforcementand securityservices to Virginia publicelementary and secondary schools and as choolse curity officerasanindividualwhoisemployedbythelocalschoolboardforthesingularpurposeof maintainingorderanddi scipline, preventing crime, investigating violations of school board policies, and detaining and apprehending persons violating the law or school board policies on schoolpropertyoratschool -sponsoredeventsandwhoisresponsiblesolelyforensuringthe safety, security, and welfare of all students, faculty, staff, and visitors in the assigned school. Themeasurealsodirects the Department of Criminal Justice Services, inconsultation with the Department of Education and the Virginia State Crime Commis sion, to establish compulsory minimumstandardsforemploymentandjob -entryandin -servicetrainingcurriculaand certificationrequirements for schools ecurity of ficers; the training and certification will be administeredbytheVirginiaCenterforSchoo lSafety.Schoolsecurityofficersareprecluded from appointment as conservators of the peace and as special police of ficers. A second enactment clause provides that the training and employments tandards will be applicable to personsemployedasschool securityofficersonandafterSeptember15,2003.

Fiscalimplications: ThelegislationdirectstheDepartmentofCriminalJusticeServices (DCJS)todevelop,inconjunctionwiththeDepartmentofEducationandtheVirginiaState CrimeCommission,thecompulsoryminimumstandardsforemployment,in -servicetraining andcertificationrequirementsforschoolsecurityofficersandchargestheVirginiaCenterfor SchoolSafetywithadministeringtheapplicationofthosestandards.Thedepartmentadvises thatitwouldrequireapproximately\$300,000andtw oFTEtomeettherequirementsofthe

legislation, as the Virginia Center for School Safety has been largely unfunded since its inception.

TheGeneralAssemblyprovidedDCJSthreeFTEandtheauthoritytouseanadditional \$300,000fromtheexistingappr opriationfortheSchoolResourceOfficerIncentiveGrants FundtosupportalloftheactivitiesoftheCenter.ItappearsthattheCenterwillbeableto issuefewergrantstolocalities,asitwillhave\$300,000lessintheFundtoaward.

TheDe partmentofEducationadvisesthatwhilethelegislationcallsforthedevelopmentof standards, its tates that local school boards may hir eschool security of ficers and school resource of ficers but does not compel them to, therefore the reisnof is calimp act.
