The bill also provides that property owners with structures or property incle arandimminent danger from erosion and storm drainages hall be allowed to erect protective bulk heads or other equivalent structural improvements as approved by the Virginia Beach Wetlands Board, and requires that the applicant consent in writing to the further experience of bulk heads typing into the applicant's bulk head from adjacent properties. These provisions shall expire on January 1,2006.

Fiscalimplications: According to the Departmento fEnvironmental Quality, if the billis adopted in its present form, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) may require the Virginia Coastal Resources Management Program to submit a formal program changed ocument. It may take up to one year to develop the document due to the need to coordinate with all agencies that are members of the Virginia coastal program, meet public participation requirements, and review policy. During the development process, NOAA has the authority to with hold allor part of the annual federal grant funds provided under the Coastal Zone Management Act for the Virginia coastal program. Further, if NOAA does not agree to the program change, the coastal programmay no longer beeligible for federal funds.
