Summary/Purpose: Thislegislationp roposestoamend§§2.2 -1509,2.2 -1510and9.1 -169 oftheCodeofVirginia,requiringthatforanyincreaseordecreaseinHB599fundingforlaw enforcementexpendituresoflocalgovernmentsshallequaltheanticipatedincreaseor decreaseintotalgenera lfundrevenuecollectionsfortherelevantfiscalyearasprovidedinthe generalappropriationsact. Thebillfurtherstatesthatinnoeventshallanypercentagechange intheamountsoffundstobedistributedtolocalitiesforanyfiscalyearbeamen dedor otherwisechangedaftertherelevantfiscalyearhasbegun.

- **8.Fiscalimplications:** The fiscal implications of this legislation are uncertain. The 599 program provides a significant amount of general funds upport to localities to operate police departments and the level of funding is currently tied to the relative growth or decline of general fundre venues. While the Code of Virginia says the funds are for law enforcement, there is no requirement that the funds be spent on law enforcement. It is impossible to estimate the fiscal impact upon the Commonwealth.

However, it is important to note that should this legislation pass, it will limit tthestate'sability toadjustitsobligationstolocalities, whether positively or negatively, should prevailing economic conditions affect general fundrevenues. For example, under Chapter 1073, of the 2000ActsofAssembly,theFY01generalfundappro priationforthe599programwas \$176,697,829andforFY02itwas\$188,713,282,basedupongeneralfundrevenueestimates priortothebiennium. Theintroduced amendments to Ch. 1073, sought to correct the funding levelforFY02basedonupdatedrevenuee stimates. With the budget impasse that arose duringthe2001SessionoftheGeneralAssembly,noamendmentstoCh.1073were authorized.Intheabsenceofabudgetaction,599fundswerereducedbyExecutiveOrder 74(01)tomoreaccuratelyreflectrevenu es.Thosefundswerefurtherreducedunderthe CaboosebillintroducedatthebeginningofthecurrentSessionoftheGeneralAssemblyto reflectcontinuingeconomicdeclines. If this legislation were in place those reductions would notbeallowable andtheCommonwealth'sobligationswouldremainconstantinspiteof worseningeconomic conditions placing the general funding precarious position.
