- 8. Fiscalimplications: ThisbillwouldrequiretheDepartmentofMotorVehicles(DMV)to collectanadditionaltwo -dollarsurchargeonallmotorvehicleregistrations, effectiveJuly1, 2002(statefiscalyear2003). This, inturn, wouldallowDMVto increase its annual collections by an estimated \$10,400,000, which would be transferred to the Virginia Department of Health (VDH) per Section 46.2 -694 of the Code of Virginia for the provision of Emergency Medical Services (see other comments -item#11 for additional details). DMV estimates that it would incur minimal expenses for programming costs associated with the implementation of this legislation, while VDH would require a dequate nongeneral fund (NGF) appropriation beginning in FY2003 to expend to his additional revenue.

Theincreasedrevenuewouldbedistributedtospecific programs, organizations and all jurisdictions in accordance to percentages specified in Section 46.2-694, *Codeof Virginia*, as follows:
 - ◆ VirginiaAssociationofVolunteerRescueSquads(2.50%) —Atradeorganizationthat providesrescuetraining(example:emergencyvehicleoperation,swiftwaterrescue,etc.)
 - ◆ ImproveEmergencyMedicalServices(13.50%) —AdministeredbyVDH,whichsupports emergencymedicalservicesandadvancedlifesupporttraining,andEMSrecruitmentand retentionprograms(allfundsforsuchsupportshallbeusedtorecruitandretainvolunteer EMSpersonnelonly,includingpublicawarenesscampaigns,technicalassistance programsandsimilaractivities).
 - ◆ StatesupportfortheVDHOfficeofEMS(17.25%) —StatewideEMSprogramsupport andotherEMSprogramsincludingtraumaregistrysupport,etc.
 - RegionalEMSCouncilSupportandStatePoliceFunding(10.0%)
 - ◆ RescueSquadAssi stanceFund(31.75%) –Non -profitEMSagenciesincludingvolunteer fireandrescueorganizationscanreceivefundingforequipmentthroughmatchinggrants.
 - ♦ ReturntoLocalities(25.0%) —Providesfundingfortrainingofvolunteerorsalaried emergencymedi calservicepersonneloflicensed,nonprofitemergencymedicalservices agenciesandforthepurchaseofnecessaryequipmentandsuppliesforuseinsuchlocality forsuchagenciesandEMSservices.Fundingforvolunteerfireandrescuesquadsarealso providedinthispercentage.
