4. Title Carrying firearms during period of protective order.

5. Summary/Purpose: Clarifies that any person who is subject to a protective order is prohibited from possessing a handgun while the order is in effect, even if he holds a concealed handgun permit. A violation is a Class 1 misdemeanor.

6. Fiscal Impact: PRELIMINARY, See Item 8.

7. Budget amendment necessary: No.

8. Fiscal implications : The fiscal impact of the proposed legislation is not known. Any fiscal impact would depend on the number of convictions. Any increase in jail population due to the imposition of a Class 1 misdemeanor will increase costs to the state.

The Commonwealth pays the localities \$8.00 a day for each misdemeanor held in a jail. It also funds most of the jails' operating costs, e.g. correctional officers. The state's share of these costs on a per inmate, per day basis varies from locality to locality. The estimated total state support for local jails per inmate, per day, averaged approximately \$30.94 in FY 2000.

9. Specific agency or political subdivisions affected: Compensation Board, local and regional jails.
