4. Title: Personsacquittedofmisdemeanorsbyreasonofinsanity.

5. Summary/Purpose: Thisb illprovides that aperson found not guilty of a misdemean or by reasonof insanity shall remain in the custody of the Commissioner of the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation (DMHMRSAS) for a period not to exceed one year from the date of acq uittal. It also provides that prior to or at the conclusion of one year, if the Commissioner determines that the acquittee meets the criteria for conditional or unconditional release, emergency custody, temporary detention, or involuntary commitment, hes hall petition the committing court to accomplish this. In addition, written notice of an acquittee' srelease after one year in the custody of the Commissioner is to be provided by the Commissioner to the attorney for the Common wealth for the committing unconducted by the Stan 30 days prior to the release.

8. Fiscalimplications : Thisbillseekstoprovideamoreexpeditiouspathtodischarge misdemeanantNotGuiltybyReasonofInsanity(NGRI) patients,aswellasadvancethegeneral goalofprovidingmentalhealthtreatmentservicesintheleastrestrictivesetting.Itappliesto misdemeanantNGRIpatientscurrentlyinDMHMRSASfacilitiesaswellasthosewhoare acquittedduetoNGRIonora fterJuly1,2002.Forcurrentpatients,implementationofthisbill's requirementsmustoccuronorbeforeOctober1,2002.

Therearecurrently38misdemeanantNGRIpatientsinDMHMRSASfacilities,withvaried criminalhistories.Manyinthisgroupwe reacquittedofminorcrimes,suchaspetitlarcenyor trespassing.Afewhadbeenconvictedoffelonies,priortothecommissionoftheirNGRI offense.

Itisanticipatedthatseveralofthose38misdemeanantNGRIpatientscurrentlyinDMHMRSAS facilitiescouldbetransferredtoacivilcommitmentstatusandreceiveservicesinacivilunit. Manyofthesepatientshavereceivedservicesinsecure/forensicunitsduringhospitalizationin theDMHMRSASfacilities.Primarilybecauseofincreasedsecurity requirements,theseunits havehighercoststhancivilunits.

Althoughsomeofthesecurrentpatientsmaybeeligibleforreleaseortransfertolesscostlyunits, itisanticipatedtherewouldbelittlecostsavings.Sinceahighnumberofthemisdeme anant NGRIsarepatientsatfacilitiesstaffedaccordingtosettlementagreementswiththeU.S. DepartmentofJustice,therearenotexpectedtobechangesinstaffingrequirementsresulting fromachangeincommitmentstatusaffectingthislimitedpatient population.Inaddition,bed spacefreedupbythischangeinstatuswouldberapidlyfilled,duetocontinuingdemandfor mentalhealthtreatmentservicesavailableinafacilitysetting.Forthosewhoareconditionally released,therearegenerallycos tsofupto\$6,000percaseforfollow -upservices.Itislikelythat therewouldbeanincreaseintheamountneededforthesefollow -upservicesifasignificant numberofpatientsisfoundtobeeligibleforconditionalreleasetothecommunity;howeve r,this amountisunknownatthistime.

ThereisnodataavailableatthistimetodeterminethenumberofpatientsadmittedafterJuly1, 2002towhomthisbill'sprovisionswouldapply.Itisexpected,however,thatthesepatients wouldaddtotheco ntinuingdemandforfacilitymentalhealthtreatmentservicesasnotedabove. Follow-upcostsforthosewhoareconditionallyreleasedwillbeincurred,butthereisnodata availabletodeterminetheeligiblenumber.
