- **4. Title**: DepartmentofProfessionalandOccupationalRegulation;BoardforProfessionalSoil ScientistsandWetlandProfessionals;penalty
- 5. Summary/Purpose: The billwould create a new voluntary certification program for wetland delineators. The program would be combined with the existing Board for Professional Soil Scientists which would create the new Board for Professional Soil Scientists and Wetland Professionals. The number of Board members would increase from five tonine. In order to be come a Virginia certified professional wetland delineator, a person would have to meet the educational and experience requirements required by the proposa landary regulations the Board may promulgate. Violation of the provisions of this legislation is a Class 1 misdemeanor.

- **7. Budgetamendmentnecessary** :No.Thenongeneralfundappropriationforthe Department ofProfessionalandOccupationalRegulationcanbeincreasedadministrativelyifnecessary.
- 8. Fiscalimplications: Thisbillcreatesanewcategoryofregulationunderthecurrent operationsoftheBoardforSoilScientists. Theregulatoryp rogramforSoilScientists alreadyinplacewithabout100licensees, and the agency is currently conducting all regulatory activities for that program. This legislation would increase the size of the Board from five members to nine members, and add ab out 150 regulants. Board member travel and perdiem costs will increase by \$3,400 for four board meetings in the first year, and by \$2,500 for three board meetings annually in following years. The agency can absorb that small

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additional cost within its current appropriation, and is not requesting additional funding. No additional positions are requested to expand the Board's responsibilities to include Wetland Delineators.

Revenues: Inaccordance with the provisions of Section 54.1 -113 (Callahan A ct) of the Code of Virginia, licensing fees will be established at rates adequate to support the Board's operating costs and approportion at eshare of agency support costs. DPOR expects Wetland Delineator fees to provide additional revenue of approximately \$22,500 during fiscal year 2004, when applications for initial licensure would be received. Licenses are valid for a period of two years, sorevenues from Wetland Delineator fees would be immaterial during fiscal year 2005. Renewal revenues would be app roximately \$26,000 for fiscal year 2006, and for the second year of future biennia.
