- 5. Summary/Purpose: The bill would create a new voluntary certification program for wetland delineators. The program would be combined with the existing Board for Professional Soil Scientists which would create the new Board for Professional Soil Scientists and Wetla nd Professionals. The number of Board members would increase from five tonine. In order to be come a Virginia certified professional wetland delineator, aperson would have to meet the educational and experience requirements required by the proposal and any regulation sthe Board may promulgate. Violation of the provisions of this legislation is a Class 1 misdemeanor.

- 8. Fiscalimplications: Thisbillcreatesanew categoryofregulationunderthecurrent operationsoftheBoardforSoilScientists. TheregulatoryprogramforSoilScientists is alreadyinplacewithabout100licensees, and the agency is currently conducting all regulatory activities for that program. This legislation would increase the size of the Board from five members to nine members, and add about 150 regulants. Board member travel and per diem costs will increase by \$3,400 for four board meetings in the first year, and by \$2,500 for three board meetings annually infollowing years. The agency can absorb that small

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additional cost within its current appropriation, and is not requesting additional funding. No additional positions are requested to expand the Board's responsibilities to in clude Wetland Delineators.

Revenues: Inaccordance with the provisions of Section 54.1 -113 (Callahan Act) of the Code of Virginia, licensing fees will be established at rates adequate to support the Board's operating costs and appropriate share of a encysup port costs. DPOR expects Wetland Delineator fees to provide additional revenue of approximately \$22,500 during fiscal year 2004, when applications for initial licensure would be received. Licenses are valid for a period of two years, sorevenues from Wetland Delineator fees would be immaterial during fiscal year 2005. Renewal revenues would be approximately \$26,000 for fiscal year 2006, and for the second year of future biennia.
