- **7. Budgetamendmentnecessary:** Yes.Item347shouldbeamendedtoincreasethe nongeneralfundappropriationforDepartmentofRehabilitativeServicesandaddone nongeneralfundposition.Inaddition,Item312shouldbeamendedtodecreasethe nongeneralfundappropriationforVirginiaDepartmentofHealth.
- **8. Fiscalimplications:** Thislegislationchangesthedistributionofthefundsinthe CommonwealthNeuro tramaInitiative(CNI)TrustFund.TheCNITrustFundwascreatedin 1997(SB1132)asaspecialnon -revertingfundadministeredbyanAdvisoryBoard.In1998, thelawwasamendedtoprovidethat:(i)moneysintheCNITrustFund"shallbeusedsolely

tosupportgrantsforVirginia -basedorganizations, institutions, andresearchers" and (ii) "fiftypercent[ofthemoneysintheFund] shall be allocated for research on the mechanisms and treatment of neurotrama and fiftypercent shall be allocated for rehabilitative services." Under the proposed legislation, the provisions of the program remain the same except that the CNIT rust Fund will be allocated 47.5 percent for research on neurotrauma, 47.5 percent for rehabilitative services, and five percent for he Department of Rehabilitative Services costs for administering and staffing the CNIA dvisory Board. The agency needs one nongeneral fund position for administrative functions.
