5. Summary/Purpose:

Regulation of Certain Private and out -of-state Institutions of Higher Education clarifies and strengthensthepresentregulatoryschemeforapprovalofprivateandout -of-stateinstitutions tooperateandgrantdegreesinVirginia.Thisbill(i)defineskeyterms relatingtothis approvalprocess;(ii)setsoutexemptionsforsuchactivitiesasgrantinghonorarydegreesand certainprofessionaltrainingprogramsthataresubjecttoregulatoryboards, postsecondary institutionsregulatedbytheDepartmentofEducati onthatoffernondegreeprograms, other noncreditprograms,contractprograms,etc.;(iii)establishestheStateCouncilofHigher Education for Virginia's authority to adopt regulations for procedures, minimal academic standards, protections for students, and information to assist third parties who relyon postsecondarycredentials;(iv)mandatesthatapprovalbeobtainedfromtheCouncilpriorto usingtheterm"college"or"university, "enrollingstudents, offeringdegrees, etc.; (v) grandfatherscertain institutionsthatwereinexistencepriortoJuly1,1980;(vi)clarifiesthe division of authority between the State Council and the Department of Education, i.e., that anyinstitutionthatisapprovedtograntdegrees, does not offernon -degreecreditp rograms butdoesoffercertificateanddiplomaprogramsfordegreecreditwillonlybesubjecttothe authorityoftheCouncil;and(vii)clearlynotestheCouncil'sauthoritytograntprovisional approvalortomodifyapreviousapproval,torefuse,revo keorsuspenditsapprovalunder certaincircumstances, and to issue emergency actions; (viii) student records are protected throughrequirements formaintenance and orderly transfer in the event of a closure. Fees maybecharged. Violations of the sepro visionswillbepunishableasaClass1misdemeanor. Further, the Council may institute a proceeding in equity to enjoin any violation of a provisionandwillbeentitledtoreasonableattorney'sfeesandcostsuponsubstantially prevailing on the merits unless special circumstances would render such an award unjust. The oldchaptergoverningprivateandout -of-stateinstitutionsisrepealed;theCouncil'spresent regulations are continued until new regulations are in place, and the Council is required to promulgateemergencyregulations.

- **8.Fiscalimplications:** If this bill is passed, there will be some fiscal implications for the non-public institutions, which are regulated by the islaw. Institutions will be impacted by:
 - The possible assessment of fees for approval activities
 - Implementationofasurety/guarantyinstrumentrequirement
 - Increased protection of student records

ThereisnofiscalimplicationfortheStateCouncilofH igherEducationforVirginia. There couldbeafuturefiscalimpactforthoseinstitutionscoveredbythisprovisionshouldfeesbe assessedforfutureservices. However, atthis pointafees chedule has not been proposed and planist ostudy thematter more fully during the APA regulation revision process.
