5. Summary/Purpose:

Undercurrentlaw, acourt may revoke a suspended sentence for any violation which occurred during the probationary period and conduct a hearing any time up to one year after the expiration of the probationary hearing to determine if the suspended sentence should be reimposed. The proposed legislation would require on ly that the court is sue process, compelling the offender to appear in court regarding the alleged violation, within one year of the expiration of the probationary period. The actual hearing to determine if the suspended sentence should be reimposed could take place more than a year after the expiration of the probationary period.

8. Fiscalimplications:

The bill tightens a loophole in current law under which an offender in visus pended sentence can abscondor otherwise hide until one year after the expiration of his probationary period and thus avoid imposition of a suspended sentence. The bill could result in an increase in person son supervised probation or in prison, but it is not feasible to project the extent of such potential increase. However, the number is expected to be relatively small. Thus, the fiscal impact of the legislation, if any, will be negligible.
