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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That §§ 10.1-2300 and 10.1-2301 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 10.1-2300. Definitions.
13	As used in this chapter, unless the context requires a different meaning:
14	"Field investigation" means the study of the traces of human culture at any site by means of
15	surveying, sampling, excavating, or removing surface or subsurface material, or going on a site with that
16	intent.
17	"Object of antiquity" means any relic, artifact, remain, including human skeletal remains, specimen,
18	or other archaeological article that may be found on, in or below the surface of the earth which has
19	historic, scientific, archaeologic or educational value.
20	"Person" means any natural individual, partnership, association, corporation or other legal entity.

	"Site" means a geographical area on dry land that contains any evidence of human activity which is
22	or may be the source of important historic, scientific, archaeologic or educational data or objects.
23	"State archaeological site" means an area designated by the Department in which it is reasonable to
24	expect to find objects of antiquity.
25	"State archaeological zone" means an interrelated grouping of state archaeological sites.
26	"State Archaeologist" means the individual designated pursuant to § 10.1-2301.
27	"State-controlled land" means any land owned by the Commonwealth or under the primary
28	administrative jurisdiction of any state agency. State agency shall not mean any county, city or town, or
29	any board or authority organized under state law to perform local or regional functions. Such land
30	includes but is not limited to state parks, state wildlife areas, state recreation areas, highway
31	rights-of-way and state-owned easements.
32	§ 10.1-2301. Duties of Director.
33	The Director shall:
34	1. Coordinate all archaeological research on state-controlled land and in state archaeological sites and
35	zones;
36	2. Coordinate a survey of significant archaeological sites located on state-controlled land, and upon
37	request, survey and officially recognize significant archaeological sites on privately owned property;
38	3. Identify, evaluate, preserve and protect sites and objects of antiquity which have historic,
	scientific, archaeologic or educational value and are located on state-controlled land or on state
40	archaeological sites or zones;
41	4. Protect archaeological sites and objects located on state-controlled land or on state archaeological
42	sites or zones from neglect, desecration, damage and destruction;
43	5. Ensure that archaeological sites and objects located on state-controlled land or on state
44	archaeological sites or zones are identified, evaluated and properly explored so that adequate records
45	may be made;
46	6. Encourage private owners of designated state archaeological sites to cooperate with the
47	Commonwealth to preserve the site; and
48	7. Encourage a statewide archaeological education program to inform the general public of the
<b>49</b>	importance of its irreplaceable archaeological heritage-; and
50	8. Designate a State Archaeologist who shall assist the Director by coordinating and overseeing the
51	carrying out of the provisions of this chapter and who shall perform such other duties as required by
52	the Director. The State Archaeologist shall be a technically-trained archaeologist and shall have both a
53	practical and theoretical knowledge of archaeology.
