That § 33.1-346 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 11 § 33.1-346. Dumping trash, etc., on highway, right-of-way or private property; penalty. 12 13 A. It shall be unlawful for any person to dump or otherwise dispose of trash, garbage, refuse, litter, 14 or other unsightly matter, on public property, including a public highway, right-of-way, property adjacent to such highway or right-of-way, or on private property without the written consent of the 15 owner thereof or his agent. Any violation of this subsection shall constitute a misdemeanor punishable 16 17 by confinement in jail for not more than twelve months and a fine of not less than \$250 or more than 18 \$2,500, either or both. B. When any person is arrested for a violation of this section, and the matter alleged to have been 19 20 illegally dumped or disposed of has been ejected from a motor vehicle or transported to the disposal site 21 in a motor vehicle, the arresting officer may comply with the provisions of § 46.2-936 in making such 22 arrest. When a violation of the provisions of this section has been observed by any person, and the matter 23 24 illegally dumped or disposed of has been ejected or removed from a motor vehicle, the owner or operator of such motor vehicle shall be presumed to be the person ejecting or disposing of such matter. 25 26 However, such presumption shall be rebuttable by competent evidence. 27 C. Any person convicted of a violation of this subsection section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor 28 punishable by confinement in jail for not more than twelve months and a fine of not less than \$250 or 29 more than \$2,500, either or both.

30 [In lieu of the imposition of confinement in jail, the court may order the defendant to perform up to 31 24 hours of community service in litter abatement activities.] [Additionally, any person convicted of a violation of this section may be ordered to perform up to 100 hours of community service in litter 32 33 abatement activities or have his driving privileges in the Commonwealth suspended for up to one year. 34 C. D. The governing bodies of counties, cities and towns are hereby authorized to adopt ordinances 35

not in conflict with the provisions of this section, and may repeal, amend or modify such ordinances. 36 D. E. The provisions of this section shall not apply to the lawful disposal of such matter in landfills.
