	A BILL to amend and reenact § 28.2-302.8 of the Code of Virginia, relating to Class II fishing guide

10 11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That § 28.2-302.8 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 28.2-302.8. Headboat or charterboat; rental boats.
13	A. The Commission may establish the sale of a fishing guide license and Class II guide license. If
14	established, such fishing guide license or Class II guide license shall be required for each charterboat
15	and headboat captain.
16 17	The Commission may limit the sale of such licenses when deemed necessary by the Commission for effective fisheries management.
18	1. A guide license may be purchased by a charterboat or headboat captain.
19	2. Class II guide licenses may be purchased and used for the following circumstances only:
20	a. Charterboat or headboat owners with more than 1 boat may purchase a single Class II guide
21 22	license to cover up to 5 additional boats, as long as each boat is registered on the license and appropriate fees paid;
$\frac{22}{23}$	b. The boat owner is not a U.S. Coast Guard-licensed captain, but hires a U.S. Coast
24	Guard-licensed captain to operate the boat for recreational fishing charters; or
25	c. More than 1 U.S. Coast Guard-licensed captain own the boat operated for recreational fishing
26	charters.
27 28	3. The holder of any guide licenses used for recreational fishing is responsible for any violations of this chapter committed by the captain while operating the boat as a charterboat for the purpose of
20 29	recreational fishing.
30	4. The Commission is responsible for setting the fees for the guide license, including the fees for
31	additional boats being registered under 1 Class II guide license.
32	B. The number of fishing guide and Class II guide licenses shall be limited to a total of 500. The
33 34	initial allotment of licenses to be issued shall include all charterboat licenses purchased on or before May 1, 2002, plus an additional 10 percent of that amount. An additional number of licenses, up to 10
35	percent of the total number of licenses issued the previous year, may be sold each subsequent year, up
36	to a maximum of 500.
37	C. 1. The application for either the fishing guide or the Class II guide license shall include a copy of
38 39	the applicant's current U.S. Coast Guard license permitting him to carry passengers for hire. The fee for
40	the license shall not exceed \$100. The Commission may reduce the fee charged for the saltwater recreational fishing license under subsection B by an amount equal to the fee for the fishing guide <i>or</i>
41	Class II guide license.
42	2. New applicants for either the fishing guide or the Class II guide license shall complete an
43	apprenticeship program under a captain holding a current Virginia guide license pursuant to
44 45	<i>regulations to be established by the Commission.</i> B <i>D</i> . The owner of a headboat or charterboat annually shall purchase a recreational fishing license
4 6	which covers his customers and the captain and mate of the vessel to meet the requirements set forth in
47	§ 28.2-302.1. The annual cost of the license shall be \$150 for uninspected vessels licensed by the United
48	States Coast Guard to carry six 6 fishing passengers or fewer and, for boats United States Coast Guard
49 50	certified to carry a number of fishing passengers greater than six, \$150 plus \$4 for each passenger over six 6 for which the best is designed
50 51	six 6 for which the boat is designed. C E. The owner of a boat rental service shall purchase a recreational fishing license which covers his
51 52	customers to meet the requirements set forth in § 28.2-302.1. The annual cost of the license shall be
53	\$7.50 per boat with a maximum fee of \$500, whichever is less.
54	D F. Charterboat and headboat operators shall report such data as are deemed necessary by the
55 56	Commission for the effective fisheries management as a condition of issuance of the license.
56	G. Transfer of guide licenses shall be regulated by the Commission.

57 E H. All funds collected pursuant to this section shall be paid into the state treasury to the credit of 58 the Virginia Saltwater Recreational Fishing Development Fund, as established by § 28.2-302.3. INTRODUCED

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
