That § 2, as amended, of Chapter 91 of the Acts of Assembly of 1948 is amended and reenacted 11 12 as follows: 13 § 2. Town Officials. 14 (1) The officers of said town shall be a mayor, six councilmen, clerk, treasurer, sergeantchief of 15 *police*, assessor and such other officers as the council may deem necessary and proper. The mayor shall 16 be elected at a regular municipal election to be held on the first Tuesday in May, in the year 1990, and every two years thereafter, in the manner prescribed by law, for a term of two years beginning on July 1 17 next following his election, and shall serve until his successor shall have been elected and qualified. 18 19 In the year 1990, six councilmen shall be elected at a regular municipal election to be held on the 20 first Tuesday in May. Those three councilmen receiving the greatest number of votes shall serve the full four-year term. Those three elected members receiving the fewest number of votes shall serve until the 21 22 year 1992. 23 Three councilmen shall be elected at a regular municipal election to be held on the first Tuesday in 24 May, in the year 1992 for four-year terms. Three councilmen shall be elected at a regular municipal 25 election to be held on the first Tuesday in May, in the year 1994 for four-year terms; thereafter all councilmen shall be elected every four years, in the manner prescribed by law, for terms beginning on 26 27 July 1 next following their election, each of whom shall serve until his successor shall have been elected 28 and qualified. 29 Each officer of said town shall take the oath prescribed by State law, and execute the required bond, 30 prior to entry upon his duties. The council shall be a continuing body, and no measure pending before 31 such body shall abate or be discontinued by reason of expiration of term of office or removal of any of 32 the members. Vacancies in the office of mayor and on the council shall be filled for the unexpired term 33 by a majority vote of the remaining members. The present mayor and council shall continue in office 34 until the expiration of the terms for which they were respectively elected. 35 (2) The council shall appoint a clerk, a treasurer and such other officers as the council may deem necessary or proper, all of whom shall hold office at and during the pleasure of the council, and shall 36 37 qualify for their respective offices as required by law, and shall furnish such bonds as may be required 38 by the council. The same person may hold two or more of these offices at the discretion of the council. 39 The officers as appointed by the council shall perform such services, and receive such compensation, 40 as the council may provide. 41 (3) The council shall appoint a town sergeant chief of police who shall qualify and give bond in such amount as the council may require. The sergeant chief of police shall be vested with the power of a 42 conservator of the peace, and shall have the same powers and perform the same duties within the 43 corporate limits of the town, and to a distance of one mile beyond, as was formerly had and performed 44 45 by constables. He shall perform such other duties, and receive such compensation as the council may 46 provide. The council may appoint such other persons as policemen and assistants of the sergeantchief of 47 police, and pay them such compensation as the council may think necessary and proper. Any reference 48 to the town sergeant in any ordinance of the Town of Damascus heretofore adopted shall be deemed a 49 reference to the chief of police. 50 (4) The mayor shall preside at all meetings of the council and perform such other duties as may be 51 prescribed by this charter, and by the general laws, and such as may be imposed by the council 52 consistent with his office. He shall be entitled to vote upon measures pending before the council only in 53 event all the other members are present and voting and are equally divided for and against such measure. He shall see that peace and order are preserved, and that persons and property within the town 54 55 are protected. He shall perform such other services and functions as may be necessary or proper, and shall receive such compensation as may be provided by the council. In event of the mayor's absence, or 56

60 (6) The administration and government of the Town of Damascus shall be vested in the town 61 council, with the mayor as the executive and tie-breaker as herein provided, all of whom shall be 62 residents and qualified voters of the town. The council shall have full power and authority, except as 63 herein otherwise stated, to exercise all the powers conferred upon the town, and to pass all legal laws 64 and ordinances relating to its municipal affairs. Each member of the council may receive a salary, or per 65 diem allowance, for his services as such member, the amount thereof to be fixed by the council, but such salary or allowances shall not exceed one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per year for each such 66 member. The council may create, appoint, or elect such boards, bodies, departments, or officers as may 67 be permitted or required by this charter or the general laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia, and fix **68** 69 their compensation and define their duties.

(7) The council shall have one regular meeting each month, the time for such meeting being fixed by ordinance. Special meetings shall be called by the clerk of the council upon the request of the mayor or any four councilmen. The reasonable notice of such special meetings shall be given to each member of the council and the mayor. No business shall be transacted at a special meeting except that for which the special meeting is called, unless the council be all present and unanimous. A majority of said councilmen shall constitute a quorum for the legal transaction of its business.
