A BILL to amend and reenact § 2.2-2219 of the Code of Virginia, to amend the Code of Virginia by adding a section numbered 2.2-2232.1, and to repeal § 2.2-2221.1 of the Code of Virginia, relating to the Innovative Technology Authority; broadband policy and deployment; and the Center for Innovative Technology.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

13 1. That § 2.2-2219 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted, and that the Code of 14 Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 2.2-2232.1 as follows:

15 § 2.2-2219. Declaration of public purpose; Authority created.

A. It is found and determined by the General Assembly that there exists in the Commonwealth of 16 Virginia a need to (i) promote the economic development of the Commonwealth by attracting and 17 retaining high technology jobs and businesses in Virginia; (ii) increase industry competitiveness by 18 supporting the application of innovative technologies that improve productivity and efficiency; (iii) 19 20 mobilize support for high technology industries to commercialize new products and processes, including organizing assistance for small business and supporting select industry sectors and regional high 21 technology efforts; (iv) enhance and expand the scientific and technological research and development 22 23 capabilities of the institutions of higher education in the Commonwealth and coordinate such capabilities 24 with the scientific and technological research and development activities and requirements of the public 25 and private sectors, including transferring technological advances to the private sector; (v) expand knowledge pertaining to scientific and technological research and development among public and private 26 27 entities; (vi) attract research and development (R&D) facilities and contracts from the federal 28 government and private sector, including coordinating efforts to identify and compete for large federal 29 and private sector R&D facilities, tracking federal technology initiatives and recommending state actions, 30 and developing a statewide strategy to compete for large R&D contracts; and (vii) facilitate and 31 coordinate the marketing, organization, utilization and development of scientific and technological research and development in the Commonwealth; and (viii) facilitate and coordinate the development, 32 33 deployment and utilization of advanced electronic communications services throughout the 34 Commonwealth.

35 B. To achieve the objectives of subsection A, there is created and constituted a political subdivision 36 of the Commonwealth to be known as "The Innovative Technology Authority." The Authority's exercise 37 of powers conferred by this article shall be deemed to be the performance of an essential governmental 38 function and matters of public necessity for which public moneys may be spent and private property 39 acquired. 40

§ 2.2-2232.1. Center for Innovative Technology; powers; reporting requirement.

41 A. The Center for Innovative Technology, created pursuant to § 2.2-2232, shall coordinate all efforts of public and quasi-public bodies within the Commonwealth to enhance or facilitate the prompt 42 availability of and access to advanced electronic communications services throughout the 43 Commonwealth, monitor trends and advances in advanced electronic communications technology to plan 44 and forecast future needs for such technology, and identify funding options. 45

46 Nothing contained in this subsection shall be construed to consolidate or otherwise transfer to the 47 Center authority over advanced electronic communications projects being conducted by public or 48 quasi-public bodies outside of the executive branch of government.

49 B. The president of the Center for Innovative Technology shall report annually by December 1 to the 50 Joint Commission on Technology and Science, created pursuant to § 30-85, regarding a review of the 51 Center's initiatives and projects, its work plan for the year and the expected results therefrom, and an 52 overview of the results that it has achieved to date, to assist the Commission in its effort to stimulate, 53 encourage, and promote the development of technology and science in the Commonwealth and sound public policies related thereto. The report shall include a review of the availability and deployment of 54 55 and funding mechanisms for advanced electronic communications services throughout the Commonwealth. 56

2. That § 2.2-2221.1 of the Code of Virginia is repealed. 57
