A BILL to amend and reenact § 60.2-602 of the Code of Virginia, relating to unemployment compensation; weekly benefit amount.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. That § 60.2-602 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:

§ 60.2-602. Weekly benefit amount.

A. Beginning September 9, 2001, and expiring January 1, 2003, for claims filed on or after September 9, 2001, and for claims for which a claimant had established a benefit year as of September 9, 2001, an eligible individual's weekly "benefit amount" shall be the amount appearing in Column B in the "Benefit Table" in this section on the line on which in Column A of such table, there appears the total wages for insured work paid to such individual in the two quarters of his base period in which such total wages were highest.

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20 B. Beginning January 1, 2003, for claims effective on or after January 1, 2003, but before January
21 1, 2004 July 6, 2003, an eligible individual's weekly "benefit amount" shall be the amount
22 appearing in Column B in the "Benefit Table" in this section on the line on which in Column A of
23 such table, there appears the total wages for insured work paid to such individual in the two
24 quarters of his base period in which such total wages were highest.

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26 C. Beginning ~~January 1, 2004~~ *July 6, 2003*, for claims effective on or after ~~January 1, 2004~~ *July 6,*

29 total wages for insured work paid to such individual in the two quarters of his base period in which
30 such total wages were highest.
