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15	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
16	1. That §§ 28.2-100, 28.2-102, 28.2-103, 28.2-106, 29.1-100, and 29.1-200 of the Code of Virginia
17	are amended and reenacted, and that the Code of Virginia is amended by adding sections
18	numbered 28.2-100.1, 28.2-103.1, 28.2-103.2, 28.2-103.3, 28.2-103.4, 28.2-103.5, 28.2-103.6, 28.2-102.7, 28.2-103.8, and 28.2-104.1 as follows:
19 20	28.2-103.7, 28.2-103.8, and 28.2-104.1 as follows: § 28.2-100. Definitions.
20	As used in this title <i>and in Title 29.1</i> , unless the context requires a different meaning:
22	"Commission" means the Virginia Game and Marine Resources Commission.
23	"Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Marine Resources.
24	"Director" means the Director of the Virginia Game and Marine Resources Commission.
25	"Fish" or "marine fish" means those finfish species which spend a major portion of their lives in
26	marine or estuarine waters. Sunfish, crappies, and carp are not considered to be marine fish.
27	"Fishing", "fisheries" or "to fish" means all operations involved in (i) taking or catching, (ii) using,
28	setting or operating apparatus employed in killing, taking or catching, or (iii) transporting or preparing
29 30	for market marine fish, shellfish, and marine organisms. "Habitat" means those state-owned bottomlands, tidal wetlands and coastal primary sand dunes which
31	are subject to regulation under Subtitle III of this title.
32	"Marine organisms" means those species other than marine finfish or marine shellfish which inhabit
33	marine or estuarine waters. Terrapin and marine mammals are considered to be marine organisms.
34	"Marine shellfish" or "shellfish" means such species of mollusca as oysters and clams, and such
35	species of crustacea as crabs.
36	"Officer" means a member of the Virginia Game and Marine Police.
37	"Territorial sea" means the waters within the belt, three nautical miles wide, that is adjacent to
38 39	Virginia's coast and seaward of the mean low-water mark. "Tidewater Virginia" means the following counties: Accomack, Arlington, Caroline, Charles City,
10	Chesterfield, Essex, Fairfax, Gloucester, Hanover, Henrico, Isle of Wight, James City, King and Queen,
1 1	King George, King William, Lancaster, Mathews, Middlesex, New Kent, Northampton, Northumberland,
12	Prince George, Prince William, Richmond, Spotsylvania, Stafford, Surry, Westmoreland, and York; and
13	the Cities of Alexandria, Chesapeake, Colonial Heights, Fairfax, Falls Church, Fredericksburg, Hampton,
14	Hopewell, Newport News, Norfolk, Petersburg, Poquoson, Portsmouth, Richmond, Suffolk, Virginia
15	Beach, and Williamsburg.
16	§ 28.2-100.1. Virginia Game and Marine Resources Commission; purpose.
17 19	The Virginia Game and Marine Resources Commission (the "Commission") is established as a policy
18 10	commission in the executive branch of state government. The purpose of the Commission is to provide public informational and educational services related to Titles 28.2 and 20.1 and to service as the
49 50	public, informational and educational services related to Titles 28.2 and 29.1, and to serve as the agency responsible for the administration and enforcement of the statutory provisions of these titles, and
51	all related rules, regulations, and legislative acts.
52	§ 28.2-102. Commission membership; chairman; qualifications; terms; meetings.
53	A. The Commission shall consist of a chairman and eight additional members 1 member from each
54	congressional district who, to the extent possible, shall be representative of all areas of interest in
55	Virginia's game and marine resources, including commercial, recreational and environmental interests. At
56	least one I member shall, at the time of his appointment, have earned his livelihood for at least five 5
57	years by working on Virginia waters and shall be licensed and registered as a commercial fisherman as

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defined in § 28.2-241, and one 1 member shall be a representative of the sport fishing industry or a 58

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59 recreational fisherman who is not employed by the commercial fishing industry. The members, including the chairman, shall be appointed by the Governor and shall serve at his pleasure, subject to confirmation 60

61 by the General Assembly.

62 B. The chairman and two 2 members of the Commission shall hold office for terms coincident with 63 the term of the Governor making the appointments, or until their successors have been appointed and 64 qualified. The terms of the remaining six members shall expire July 1, 1997, and these same six members shall be reappointed effective July 1, 1997, as successors be for 1 to 4 years; however, 65 appointments shall be made in a manner whereby no more than 3 members shall have terms that expire 66 in the same year. Their terms shall be as follows: two members shall be appointed for two-year terms, 67 two members shall be appointed for three year terms, and two members shall be appointed for four year **68** terms or until their successors are appointed and qualified. Thereafter, all appointments shall be for 69 70 terms of four years or until their successors are appointed and qualified. No person, except the chairman, shall serve more than two 2 consecutive four 4-year terms. Any vacancy shall be filled by the Governor 71 72 for the unexpired term.

73 C. The chairman shall be an experienced administrator with knowledge of seafood game and marine 74 affairs. He shall serve as Commissioner of Marine Resources. 75

D. Five The majority of members shall constitute a quorum of the Commission.

E. The Commission shall meet on the call of the chairman or three members at such times as he or 76 77 they may deem once every 3 months beginning July 1 of each year for the transaction of business, and 78 other meetings may be called by the chairman if necessary, and at such places as he or they may 79 designate. 80

§ 28.2-103. General powers and jurisdiction of Commission; promulgation of regulations.

A. The Commission shall exercise all of the powers herein conferred and may promulgate regulations 81 and guidelines necessary to carry out the provisions of this title and of Title 29.1. Marine fisheries 82 regulations shall be promulgated according to the procedures established in Article 2 (§ 28.2-209 et seq.) 83 84 of Chapter 2 of this title. Habitat management regulations and guidelines shall be promulgated in accordance with the procedures established in Article 2 (§ 28.2-209 et seq.) of Chapter 2 of this title, 85 unless specifically provided in subdivision C 15 or subsection F of § 2.2-4011. 86

B. The Commission shall exist to provide public, informational and educational services related to 87 88 Titles 28.2 and 29.1, and to serve as the agency responsible for the administration and enforcement of 89 the statutory provisions of these titles, and all related rules, regulations, and legislative acts. The 90 Commission shall employ scientific principles and procedures, as developed, researched, recognized, and accepted within the bounds of comprehensive professional wildlife resource management, in the management of the Commonwealth's wildlife and natural resources. 91 92

C. The jurisdiction of the Commission shall include the Commonwealth's territorial sea and extend to 93 all rivers and streams throughout the Commonwealth. The Commission shall have jurisdiction over all 94 95 recreational boating, hunting and trapping, commercial and recreational fishing and all marine or freshwater fish, shellfish, or other organisms, game birds, game animals, and other wildlife and their 96 97 habitats. 98

D. The Commission is further authorized to:

99 1. Acquire by purchase, lease, exchange, gift, or otherwise, lands and waters in the Commonwealth 100 and to establish buildings, structures, dams, lakes, and ponds on such lands and waters.

101 2. Conduct operations for the preservation and propagation of game birds, game animals, fish, and 102 other wildlife in order to increase, replenish, and restock the lands and inland waters of the 103 Commonwealth.

104 3. Purchase, lease, or otherwise acquire lands and waters for game and fish refuges, preserves, or 105 public shooting and fishing, and establish such lands and waters under appropriate regulations.

4. Acquire by purchase, lease, or otherwise, lands and structures for use as public landings, 106 107 wharves, or docks; to improve such lands and structures; and to control the use of all such public 108 landings, wharves, or docks by regulation.

5. Acquire and introduce any new species of game birds, game animals, or fish on the lands and 109 110 within the waters of the Commonwealth.

6. Restock, replenish, and increase any depleted native species of game birds, game animals, or fish.

7. Published and distribute educational materials pertaining to wildlife.

113 8. Hold exhibits throughout the Commonwealth for the purpose of educating school children, 114 agriculturists, and other persons in the preservation and propagation of wildlife in the Commonwealth.

9. Control land owned by and under control of the Commonwealth in Back Bay, its tributaries, and 115 the North Landing River from the North Carolina line to North Landing Bridge. The Commission shall 116 117 regulate or prohibit by regulation any drilling, dredging or other operation designed to recover or obtain shells, minerals, or other substances in order to prevent practices and operations that would 118 119 harm the area for fish and wildlife.

120 10. Exercise powers it may deem advisable for conserving, protecting, replenishing, propagating, and

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121 increasing the supply of game birds, game animals, fish, and other wildlife of the Commonwealth.

122 11. Adopt resolutions or regulations conferring upon the Director all such powers, authorities, and
 123 duties as the Commission possesses and deems necessary or proper to carry out the purposes of this
 124 title.

125 12. Administer and manage the Virginia Fish Passage Grant and Revolving Loan Fund pursuant to 126 Article 1.1 (§ 29.1-101.2 et seq.) of Chapter 1 of Title 29.1.

127 13. Maintain an office at such place or places as the Commission may designate.

128 § 28.2-103.1. Acceptance of gifts, etc.

In addition to the authority granted the Commission by § 28.2-103, the Commission may receive
gifts, grants, bequests, and devises of property, real or personal, and of money which, if accepted, shall
be taken and held for any uses prescribed by the donor, grantor, or testator and in accord with the
purposes of this title. The Commission shall manage such properties or money in such a way as to
maximize their value to the citizens of Virginia.

134 § 28.2-103.2. Lease or contract respecting land or buildings.

135 The Commission is authorized, with the approval of the Governor, to enter into contracts respecting 136 or to lease any land or buildings leased or owned by it to private persons, corporations, associations, 137 other governmental agencies, public authorities duly created by law or political subdivisions of the 138 Commonwealth. The contracts or leases shall be (i) upon terms and conditions as deemed advisable by 139 the Commission, (ii) in a form to be approved by the Attorney General, and (iii) consistent with the **140** powers, authority and responsibilities of the Commission. If any such lease or contract is to be effective 141 for a term of more than 5 years, it shall be authorized only after a public hearing by the Commission. 142 All amounts received pursuant to leases and contracts hereunder shall be deposited in the state treasury 143 to the credit of the game protection fund.

144 § 28.2-103.3. Forest and watershed areas.

The Commission is authorized to exercise full control of the hunting and fishing rights and privileges
in and on all impounded water areas in this Commonwealth resulting from power development; and in
all forest and watershed areas in this Commonwealth that are now owned, or that may hereafter be
acquired, by the United States government, subject to the rights and power of the United States
Department of Agriculture. The Commission shall have the power to establish refuges, sanctuaries, and
public shooting and fishing preserves in these areas, under such regulations as it may deem proper.

151 § 28.2-103.4. Rules and regulations.

All rules, resolutions, regulations and policies adopted by the Commission, as provided by the
Administrative Process Act (§ 2.2-4000 et seq.), shall be reduced to writing for the Director, shall be
public documents, and shall be available to the public on request.

155 § 28.2-103.5. Audits and examinations.

156 The minute books and other records of the Commission shall be open to examination by the
157 Governor and Auditor of Public Accounts, or their representatives, at all times. The accounts of the
158 Commission shall be audited in the manner provided for the audit of other state agencies.

159 § 28.2-103.6. Disbursements, accounts for Commission.

A. The disbursements of the Commission shall be limited to the amount appropriated by the General
Assembly from the game protection fund to expenditures from the Lifetime Hunting and Fishing
Endowment Fund. In no event shall the Commonwealth pay obligations that may be incurred by the
Commission or be liable in any manner for such obligations except to the extent of the game protection
fund and the Lifetime Hunting and Fishing Endowment Fund.

165 B. Accounts for salaries, allowances, wages, and expenses authorized by the Commission shall be 166 certified to the Comptroller for payment as the Commission may direct by resolution.

167 § 28.2-103.7. Sale of timber; portion of proceeds to be paid to locality.

A. The Director is authorized to manage and harvest timber on lands owned by the Commission in accordance with the best timber and game management practices, and to sell the timber. Proceeds from the sale of such timber shall be deposited in the state treasury to the credit of the Game Protection Fund.

B. When the Director authorizes the selling of timber, which is standing or which has been cut from timber standing on land owned by the Commission, the Commission shall pay to the locality in which the standing timber is located 25 percent of the proceeds of the sale of the timber, after deducting the cost of any road constructed by the Commission that is necessary for the sale of the timber.

176 § 28.2-103.8. Payment of license and permit fees.

177 The Director may authorize the acceptance of any method of payment authorized by § 2.2-614.1 in 178 lieu of money for payment of any fees collected by the Commission or agents acting on behalf of the 179 Commission for any licenses or permits issued under this title or for any merchandise sold by the

180 *Commission.*

181 § 28.2-104.1. Director's general powers and duties.

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182 In accordance with § 2.2-106, the Governor shall appoint a Director, subject to General Assembly 183 approval, to act as chief administrative officer of the Commission. In addition to the powers designated 184 elsewhere in this title, the Director shall have the power to:

185 1. Enforce or cause to be enforced the marine fishery and habitat laws and regulations, and all laws 186 for the protection, propagation, and preservation of game birds and game animals of the Commonwealth 187 and all fish in the inland waters thereof. Inland waters shall include all waters above tidewater and the 188 brackish and freshwater streams, creeks, bays, including Back Bay, inlets, and ponds in the tidewater 189 counties and cities.

190 2. Initiate prosecution of all persons who violate such laws, and seize and confiscate wild birds, wild 191 animals, and fish that have been illegally killed, caught, transported, or shipped.

192 3. Employ persons necessary for the administrative requirements of the Commission and to designate the official position and duties of each. The salaries of all such employees shall be as provided in 193 194 accordance with law.

195 4. Perform such acts as may be necessary to the conduct and establishment of cooperative fish and 196 wildlife projects with the federal government as prescribed by acts of Congress and in compliance with 197 rules and regulations promulgated by the Secretary of the Interior.

198 5. Make and enter into all contracts and agreements necessary or incidental to the performance of 199 his duties and the execution of his powers, including, but not limited to, contracts with the United 200 States, other state agencies and governmental subdivisions of the Commonwealth.

201 6. When practicable, consult with, and keep informed, wildlife and boating constituent organizations so as to benefit Virginia's wildlife and natural resources and accomplish the Commission's mission. 202 203

§ 28.2-106. Virginia Game and Marine Police; law-enforcement responsibilities; qualifications; oath.

A. The law-enforcement division of the Commission shall be designated as the Virginia Game and 204 Marine Police. It shall exercise such powers and duties as the General Assembly may confer upon it by 205 206 law and as provided in regulations adopted pursuant to law, including but not limited to the powers and 207 duties set forth in Chapter 2 of Title 29.1 (§ 29.1-200 et seq.) relating to game and inland fisheries, and 208 the following:

209 1. Patrolling the tidal waters and shoreline of the Chesapeake Bay, its tidal tributaries, and territorial 210 sea;

2. Enforcing marine fishery and habitat conservation laws and regulations:

3. Enforcing health laws pertaining to the harvesting of seafood from condemned areas;

213 4. Enforcing or assisting other agencies in enforcing laws pertaining to the removal of obstructions and abandoned vessels from the water, to boating operation and navigation, and to larceny on the water; 214

5. Providing for water-borne safety;

6. Conducting search and rescue activities; and

217 7. Protecting from terrorist attack federal and state water-related installations and other water-related 218 locations within the tidal waters of the Commonwealth as may be designated by federal or state officials 219 as important to national security.

B. Officers of the Virginia Marine Police shall have the same powers as (i) sheriffs and other 220 221 law-enforcement officers to enforce all of the criminal laws of the Commonwealth, and (ii) regular game 222 wardens appointed pursuant to Chapter 2 (§ 29.1-200 et seq.) of Title 29.1.

223 C. A person shall be (i) at least twenty-one years old and (ii) a high school graduate or equivalent to 224 qualify for appointment as an officer.

225 D. Each officer shall qualify before the clerk of the circuit court of the county or city in which he 226 resides, or in which his district may be, by taking the oaths prescribed by law. 227

§ 29.1-100. (Effective January 1, 2003) Definitions.

As used in and for the purposes of this title and of Title 28.2 only, or in any of the regulations of 228 the Board Commission, unless the context clearly requires a different meaning: 229

"Bag or creel limit" means the quantity of game, fish or fur-bearing animals that may be taken, 230 231 caught, or possessed during a period fixed by the Board Commission. 232

"Board" means the Board of Game and Inland Fisheries.

233 "Closed season" means that period of time fixed by the Board Commission during which wild 234 animals, birds or fish may not be taken, captured, killed, pursued, hunted, trapped or possessed. 235

"Department" means the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries.

"Commission" means the Virginia Game and Marine Resources Commission.

237 "Director" means the Director of the Department of Virginia Game and Inland Fisheries Marine 238 Resources Commission.

239 "Firearm" means any weapon that will or is designed to or may readily be converted to expel single 240 or multiple projectiles by the action of an explosion of a combustible material.

"Fishing" means taking, capturing, killing, or attempting to take, capture or kill any fish in and upon 241 242 the inland waters of this the Commonwealth.

"Fur-bearing animals" includes beaver, bobcat, fox, mink, muskrat, opossum, otter, raccoon, skunk, 243

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244 and weasel.

"Game" means wild animals and wild birds that are commonly hunted for sport or food.

246 "Game animals" means deer, bear, rabbit, fox, squirrel, bobcat and raccoon.

"Game fish" means trout (including all Salmonidae), all of the sunfish family (including largemouth bass, smallmouth bass and spotted bass, rock bass, bream, bluegill and crappie), walleye or pike perch, white bass, chain pickerel or jackfish, muskellunge, and northern pike, wherever such fish are found in the waters of this *the* Commonwealth and rockfish or striped bass where found above tidewaters or in streams which are blocked from access from tidewaters by dams.

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"Game warden" means supervising wardens, and regular and special game warden.

Thunting and trapping" includes the act of or the attempted act of taking, hunting, trapping, pursuing, chasing, shooting, snaring or netting birds or animals, and assisting any person who is hunting, trapping or attempting to do so regardless of whether birds or animals are actually taken; however, when hunting and trapping are allowed, reference is made to such acts as being conducted by lawful means and in a lawful manner. The Board of Game and Inland Fisheries Commission may authorize by regulation the pursuing or chasing of wild birds or wild animals during any closed hunting season where persons have no intent to take such birds or animals.

260 "Lawful," "by law," or "law" means the statutes of this *the* Commonwealth or regulations adopted261 by the Board *Commission* which the Director is empowered to enforce.

262 "Migratory game birds" means doves, ducks, brant, geese, swan, coot, gallinules, sora and other rails,
263 snipe, woodcock and other species of birds on which open hunting seasons are set by federal
264 regulations.

265 "Muzzleloading pistol" means a firearm originally designed, made or intended to fire a projectile
266 (bullet) from one or more barrels when held in one hand and that is loaded from the muzzle or forward
267 end of the cylinder.

268 "Muzzleloading rifle" means a firearm firing a single projectile that is loaded along with the 269 propellant from the muzzle of the gun.

270 "Muzzleloading shotgun" means a firearm with a smooth bore firing multiple projectiles that are271 loaded along with the propellant from the muzzle of the gun.

"Nonmigratory game birds" means grouse, bobwhite quail, turkey and all species of birds introduced
into the Commonwealth by the Board Commission.

274 "Nuisance species" means blackbirds, crows, cowbirds, grackles, English sparrows, starlings, or those 275 species designated as such by regulations of the Board Commission, and those species found committing 276 or about to commit depredation upon ornamental or shade trees, agricultural crops, wildlife, livestock or 277 other property or when concentrated in numbers and manners as to constitute a health hazard or other 278 nuisance. However, the term nuisance does not include (i) animals designated as endangered or 279 threatened pursuant to §§ 29.1-563, 29.1-564, and 29.1-566, (ii) animals classified as game or 280 fur-bearing animals, and (iii) those species protected by state or federal law.

"Officer" means a member of the Virginia Game and Marine Police.

282 "Open season" means that period of time fixed by the Board Commission during which wild
283 animals, wild birds and fish may be taken, captured, killed, pursued, trapped or possessed.

"Pistol" means a weapon originally designed, made, and intended to fire a projectile (bullet) from
one or more barrels when held in one hand, and having one or more chambers as an integral part of or
permanently aligned with the bore and a short stock at an angle to and extending below the line of the
bore that is designed to be gripped by one hand.

288 "Possession" means the exercise of control of any wild animal, wild bird, fish or fur-bearing animal,289 or any part of the carcass thereof.

290 "Properly licensed person" means a person who, while engaged in hunting, fishing or trapping, or in any other activity permitted under this title, in and upon the lands and inland waters of this the
292 Commonwealth, has upon his person all the licenses, permits and stamps required by law.

293 "Regulation" means a regulation duly adopted by the Board Commission pursuant to the authority
 294 vested by the provisions of this title.

295 "Revolver" means a projectile weapon of the pistol type, having a breechloading chambered cylinder
296 arranged so that the cocking of the hammer or movement of the trigger rotates it and brings the next
297 cartridge in line with the barrel for firing.

298 "Rifle" means a weapon designed or redesigned, made or remade, and intended to be fired from the
299 shoulder, and designed or redesigned and made or remade to use the energy of the explosive in a fixed
300 metallic cartridge to fire only a single projectile through a rifled bore for each single pull of the trigger.

301 "Shotgun" means a weapon designed or redesigned, made or remade, and intended to be fired from
302 the shoulder, and designed or redesigned and made or remade to use the energy of the explosive in a
303 fixed shotgun shell to fire through a smooth bore or rifled shotgun barrel either a number of ball shot or
304 a single projectile for each single pull of the trigger.

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305 "Transportation" means the transportation, either upon the person or by any other means, of any wild 306 animal or wild bird or fish.

- 307 "Wildlife" means all species of wild animals, wild birds and freshwater fish in the public waters of 308 this the Commonwealth.
- 309 § 29.1-200. Appointment of Game and Marine Police Officers.

A. In addition to the Game and Marine Police officers appointed pursuant to Article 2 (§ 28.2-106 et 310 311 seq.) of Chapter 1 of Title 28.2 relating to marine resources, The the Director shall appoint regular and special game wardens Game and Marine Police officers as he may deem necessary to enforce the game 312 313 and inland fish laws and shall issue a certificate of appointment to each game warden officer.

314 B. All appointments to sworn law-enforcement positions above the rank of game warden Game and Marine Police officer within the Department shall be made by the Director of the Department from 315 among the sworn game wardens officers, except for those positions designated in subdivision 20 of 316 § 2.2-2905, or whenever the Director determines, in writing, that a position requires knowledge, skills, 317 or abilities such that a sufficient pool of qualified candidates does not exist within the Department. 318

2. That §§ 28.2-101 and 28.2-104, and Article 2 (§§ 29.1-102 through 29.1-108) and Article 3 319 320 (§§ 29.1-109 through 29.1-112) of Chapter 1 of Title 29.1 of the Code of Virginia are repealed.

3. That all regulations adopted by the Marine Resources Commission, or the Board of Game and 321 Inland Fisheries, which are in effect as of the effective date of this act and which pertain to the 322 323 subject matter of this act, shall remain in full force and effect until altered, amended or rescinded 324 by the Virginia Game and Marine Resources Commission as created pursuant to this act.

325 4. That as of July 1, 2003, the Virginia Game and Marine Resources Commission shall be deemed 326 the successor in interest to the Virginia Marine Resources Commission and to the Department of 327 Game and Inland Fisheries to the extent that this act transfers powers and duties. All right, title and interest in and to any real or tangible personal property vested in the Marine Resources Commission or the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries to the extent that this act transfers 328 329 powers and duties as of the effective date of this act shall be transferred and taken as standing in 330 331 the name of the Game and Marine Resources Commission.

332 5. That wherever any reference is made in law or regulation to the former Marine Resources Commission, or to the former Department of Game and Inland Fisheries, such reference shall be 333

334 construed to mean the Virginia Game and Marine Resources Commission, and wherever any 335 reference is made in law or regulation to the Commissioner of the former Marine Resources 336 Commission, or to the Director of the former Department of Game and Inland Fisheries, such 337 reference shall be construed to mean the Director of the Virginia Game and Marine Resources 338 Commission.

339 6. That wherever any reference is made in law or regulation to the former Virginia Marine Police, 340 or to the former game warden or wardens, such reference shall be construed to mean the Virginia 341 Game and Marine Police or officers thereof.

7. That the Governor may transfer an appropriation or any portion thereof within a state agency 342 or commission established, abolished or otherwise affected by the provisions of this act, or from 343 344 one such agency or commission to another, to support the changes in organization or responsibility resulting from or required by the provisions of this act. 345

8. That the Governor may transfer employees within any state agency or commission established 346

347 or otherwise affected by the provisions of this act, or from such agency or commission to another,

348 to support changes in organization or responsibility resulting from or required by the provisions 349 of this act.
