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1 VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER 2 An Act to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Chapter 7 of Title 2.2 an article numbered 4, consisting of sections numbered 2.2-718, 2.2-719 and 2.2-720, and to repeal §§ 2.2-710 and 3 4 37.1-62.1 of the Code of Virginia, relating to Alzheimer's disease and related disorders; report. [H 2519] 5 6 Approved 7 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Chapter 7 of Title 2.2 an article numbered 8 9 4, consisting of sections numbered 2.2-718, 2.2-719 and 2.2-720, as follows: 10 Article 4. 11 Alzheimer's Disease and Related Disorders. 12 § 2.2-718. Powers and duties of the Department with respect to Alzheimer's disease and related 13 disorders. The Department for the Aging shall serve as a referral point for linking families caring for persons 14 15 with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders with Virginia's chapters of the Alzheimer's Disease and Related Disorders Association. The Department shall provide information, counseling and referral about 16 17 services and programs that may support individuals and families dealing with Alzheimer's disease and 18 related disorders. 19 § 2.2-719. Alzheimer's and Related Diseases Research Award Fund. 20 There is established a fund to be known as the Alzheimer's and Related Diseases Research Award 21 Fund, hereafter referred to as "the Fund." The Fund shall be administered by the Virginia Center on Aging and the awards shall be made through an awards committee consisting of representatives from 22 23 the scientific and medical community and the general public. The awards shall be given annually to 24 scientists in Virginia in order to support research into the causes of Alzheimer's disease and related 25 disorders, methods of treatment, ways that families can cope with the stresses of the disease, and the 26 impact of the disease on the citizens of the Commonwealth. 27 § 2.2-720. Alzheimer's Disease and Related Disorders Commission. 28 A. The Alzheimer's Disease and Related Disorders Commission (Commission) is established as an 29 advisory commission in the executive branch of state government. The purpose of the entity is to assist 30 people with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders and their caregivers. 31 B. The Commission shall consist of 15 nonlegislative citizen members. Members shall be appointed 32 as follows: three members to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates; two members to 33 be appointed by the Senate Committee on Privileges and Elections; and 10 members to be appointed by 34 the Governor, of whom seven shall be from among the boards, staffs, and volunteers of the Virginia 35 chapters of the Alzheimer's Disease and Related Disorders Association and three shall be from the 36 public at large. 37 Initial appointments of nonlegislative citizen members shall be staggered as follows: 38 1. Two gubernatorial appointees shall be appointed for a term of one year each; 39 2. One member appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates and two gubernatorial 40 appointees shall be appointed for a term of two years each; 41 3. Two members, one appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates and one appointed by the 42 Senate Committee on Privileges and Elections, and three gubernatorial appointees shall be appointed 43 for a term of three years each; and 44 4. Two members, one appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates and one appointed by the 45 Senate Committee on Privileges and Elections, and three gubernatorial appointees shall be appointed 46 for a term of four years each. Thereafter, nonlegislative citizen members shall be appointed for a term of four years. Appointments 47 48 to fill vacancies, other than by expiration of a term, shall be for the unexpired terms. All members may 49 be reappointed. However, no nonlegislative citizen member shall serve more than two consecutive 50 four-year terms. The remainder of any term to which a member is appointed to fill a vacancy shall not constitute a term in determining the member's eligibility for reappointment. Vacancies shall be filled in 51 52 the same manner as the original appointments. 53 The Commission shall elect a chairman and vice chairman from among its membership. A majority 54 of the voting members shall constitute a quorum. The Commission shall meet at least four times each 55 year. The meetings of the Commission shall be held at the call of the chairman or whenever the

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majority of the voting members so request.

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57 C. Members shall receive such compensation for the discharge of their duties as provided in § 2.2-2813. All members shall be reimbursed for reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the discharge of their duties as provided in §§ 2.2-2813 and 2.2-2825. Funding for the costs of compensation and expenses of the members shall be provided by the Department for the Aging. 58 59 60 61

D. The Commission shall have the following powers and duties:

62 1. Examine the needs of persons with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders, as well as the needs of their caregivers, and ways that state government can most effectively and efficiently assist in meeting 63 64 those needs:

65 2. Advise the Governor and General Assembly on policy, funding, regulatory and other issues related 66 to persons suffering from Alzheimer's disease and related disorders and their caregivers;

67 3. Develop the Commonwealth's plan for meeting the needs of patients with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders and their caregivers, and advocate for such plan; 68

4. Submit a report by October 1 of each year to the Governor and General Assembly regarding the activities and recommendations of the Commission; and 69 70

71 5. Establish priorities for programs among state agencies related to Alzheimer's disease and related 72 disorders and criteria to evaluate these programs.

73 E. The Department for the Aging shall provide staff support to the Commission. All agencies of the 74 Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Commission, upon request.

75 F. The Commission may apply for and expend such grants, gifts or bequests from any source as may 76 become available in connection with its duties under this section, and may comply with such conditions 77 and requirements as may be imposed in connections therewith.

78 G. The Chairman shall submit to the Governor and the General Assembly an annual executive 79 summary of the interim activity and work of the Commission no later than the first day of each regular session of the General Assembly. The executive summary shall be submitted as provided in the 80 procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents 81 and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website. 82

H. This section shall expire on July 1, 2006. 83

2. That §§ 2.2-710 and 37.1-62.1 of the Code of Virginia are repealed. 84

85 3. Notwithstanding § 2.2-720, current members of the Alzheimer's Disease and Related Disorders Commission shall continue to serve until the expiration of their terms. Thereafter, terms 86 established by § 2.2-720 shall apply. 87
