9 10	WHEPEAS House Joint Desolution No. 154 of the 2000 Session of the Constal Assembly
10	WHEREAS, House Joint Resolution No. 154 of the 2000 Session of the General Assembly established a joint legislative commission on interstate transportation to meet with legislators from the
12	State of Maryland and representatives of the District of Columbia to advise the General Assembly and
12	the Governor on efforts to address interstate transportation issues in the Metropolitan Washington
14	Region; and
15	WHEREAS, the considerable size of this panel, the unprecedented nature of its mandate, the
16	sensitivity and complexity of the many challenges involved, and the very considerable cost associated
17	with virtually every attempt to meet those challenges have all combined to make the work of the
18	Commission very time-consuming; and
19	WHEREAS, the Commission was continued for an additional two years by House Joint Resolution
20	No. 526 of the 2001 General Assembly; and
21	WHEREAS, the Commission has not yet arrived at a sufficient consensus to permit it to make final
22	recommendations to the Virginia and Maryland state legislatures and the Washington, D.C., city council;
23	and the second sec
24	WHEREAS, however cumbersome and time-consuming this process may be, the need for
25 26	inter-jurisdictional dialogue aimed at comprehensive, creative, region-wide solutions to the area's many
20 27	and vexing transportation difficulties is so urgent, and the possible benefits from such interjurisdictional cooperation are so valuable that a long-term commitment by the Commonwealth to the process is amply
28	justified; now, therefore, be it
2 9	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Virginia-Maryland-District
30	of Columbia Joint Legislative Commission on Interstate Transportation be continued for an additional
31	three years. The members appointed pursuant to House Joint Resolution No. 526 of the 2001 Session
32	shall continue to serve, with any vacancy being filled in the same manner as the original appointment.
33	All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Commission upon request.
34	The direct costs of this study shall not exceed \$37,500 for these three additional years.
35	The Commission shall complete its work in time to submit its findings and recommendations to the
36	Governor and the 2006 Session of the General Assembly as provided in the procedures of the Division
37	of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents.
38	Implementation of this resolution is subject to subsequent approval and certification by the Joint
39	Rules Committee. The Committee may withhold expenditures or delay the period for the conduct of the
