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| 10 | Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: |
| 11 | 1. That § 15.2-2159 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: |
| 12 | § 15.2-2159. Fee for solid waste disposal by counties. |
| 13 | A. Floyd County, Highland County, any county with a population between 53,000 and 55,000, any |
| 14 | county with a population between $39,550$ and $41,550$, and any county with a population between $31,650$ |
| 15 | and 32,000 38,000 and 40,000 may levy a fee for the disposal of solid waste not to exceed the actual |
| 16 | cost incurred by the county in procuring, developing, maintaining, and improving the landfill and for |
| 17 | such reserves as may be necessary for capping and closing such landfill in the future. Such fee as |
| 18 | collected shall be deposited in a special account to be expended only for the purposes for which it was |
| 19 | levied. Except in Floyd County and any county with a population between 39,550 and 41,450, such fee |
| 20 | shall not be used to purchase or subsidize the purchase of equipment used for the collection of solid |
| 21 | waste. In Highland County and any county with a population between 53,000 and 55,000, such fee (i) |
| 22 | may only be levied upon persons whose residential solid waste is disposed of at a county landfill or |
| 22 23 | county solid waste collection or disposal facility and (ii) shall not be levied upon persons whose |
| 24 | residential waste is not disposed of in such landfill or facility if such nondisposal is documented by the |
| 25 | collector or generator of such waste as required by ordinance of such county. Documentation provided |
| 26 | by a collector of such waste pursuant to clause (ii) shall not be disclosed by the county to any other |
| 27 | person. |
| 28 | B. Any fee imposed by subsection A when combined with any other fee or charge for disposal of |
| 2 9 | waste shall not exceed the actual cost incurred by the county in procuring, developing, maintaining, and |
| 30 | improving its landfill and for such reserves as may be necessary for capping and closing such landfill in |
| 31 | the future. |
| 32 | C. Any county which imposes the fee allowed under subsection A may enter into a contractual |
| 33 | agreement with any water or heat, light, and power company or other corporation coming within the |
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| | provisions of Chapter 26 (§ 58.1-2600 et seq.) of Title 58.1 except Appalachian Power Company, |
| 35 | Shenandoah Valley Electric Cooperative, BARC Electric Cooperative and Powell Valley Electric |
| 36 | Cooperative for the collection of such fee. The agreement may include a commission for such service in |
| 37 | the form of a deduction from the fee remitted. The commission shall be provided for by ordinance, |
| 38 | which shall set the rate not to exceed five percent of the amount of fees due and collected. |
| 39 | D. Any county which imposes the fee allowed under subsection A and has a population between |
| 40 | 38,000 and 40,000 or 39,550 and 41,550 has the following authority regarding collection of said fee: |
| 41 | 1. To prorate said fee depending upon the period a resident or business is located in said county |
| 42 | during the year of fee levy; |
| 43 | 2. To levy penalty for late payment of fee as set forth in § 58.1-3916 of the Code of Virginia; |
| 44 | 3. To levy interest on unpaid fees as set forth in § 58.1-3916 of the Code of Virginia; |
| 45 | 4. To credit the fee first against the most delinquent use fee account owing; |
| 46 | 5. To require payment of the fee prior to approval of an application for rezoning, special exception, |
| 47 | variance or other land use permit; and |
| 48 | 6. To provide discounts to the standard fee rates for older persons, as defined in § 2.2-703, and |
| 49 | disabled persons based on ability to pay. |
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
