- 6 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
- 7 1. That § 19.2-389.1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:

8 § 19.2-389.1. Dissemination of juvenile record information.

9 Record information maintained in the Central Criminal Records Exchange pursuant to the provisions 10 of § 16.1-299 shall be disseminated only (i) to make the determination as provided in §§ 18.2-308.2 and 18.2-308.2:2 of eligibility to possess or purchase a firearm, (ii) to aid in the preparation of a pretrial 11 12 investigation report prepared by a local pretrial services agency established pursuant to Article 5 (§ 19.2-152.2 et seq.) of Chapter 9 of this title, a presentence or post-sentence investigation report 13 pursuant to § 19.2-264.5 or § 19.2-299 or in the preparation of the discretionary sentencing guidelines 14 worksheets pursuant to subsection C of § 19.2-298.01, (iii) to aid local community-based probation 15 programs established pursuant to the Comprehensive Community Corrections Act for Local-Responsible 16 Offenders (§ 9.1-173 et seq.) with investigating or serving adult local-responsible offenders and all court 17 service units serving juvenile delinquent offenders, (iv) for fingerprint comparison utilizing the 18 fingerprints maintained in the Automated Fingerprint Information System (AFIS) computer, and (v) to 19 20 attorneys for the Commonwealth to secure information incidental to sentencing and to attorneys for the 21 Commonwealth and probation officers to prepare the discretionary sentencing guidelines worksheets 22 pursuant to subsection C of § 19.2-298.01, and (vi) to any full-time or part-time employee of the State 23 Police, a police department or sheriff's office that is a part of or administered by the Commonwealth or 24 any political subdivision thereof, and who is responsible for the prevention and detection of crime and 25 the enforcement of the penal, traffic or highway laws of the Commonwealth, for purposes of the 26 administration of criminal justice as defined in § 9.1-101.

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
