| 11 | § 18.2-461. Giving false reports to or falsely summoning law-enforcement officials; penalty. |
| 12 | A. It shall be unlawful for any person (i) to knowingly give a false report as to the commission of |
| 13 | any crime to any law-enforcement official with intent to mislead, or (ii). A violation of this subsection |
| 14 | is a Class 6 felony. |
| 15 | B. It shall be unlawful for any person without just cause and with intent to interfere with the |
| 16 | operations of any law-enforcement official, to call or summon any law-enforcement official by telephone |
| 17 | or other means, including engagement or activation of an automatic emergency alarm. Violation of the |
| 18 | provisions of this section shall be punishable as A violation of this subsection is a Class 1 misdemeanor. |
| 19 20 | 2. That the provisions of this act may result in a net increase in periods of imprisonment or commitment. Pursuant to § 30-19.1:4, the estimated amount of the necessary appropriation cannot |
