9	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
10	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 18.2-479.1 as follows:
11	§ 18.2-479.1. Resisting lawful seizure; penalty.
12	A. If any person intentionally prevents or attempts to prevent a law enforcement officer from
13	effecting a lawful arrest for a misdemeanor, with or without a warrant, of himself or another person, he
14 15	shall be guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor. B. If any person intentionally prevents or attempts to prevent a law enforcement officer from
16	effecting a lawful arrest for a felony, with or without a warrant, of himself or another person, he shall
17	be guilty of a Class 6 felony.
18	C. For purposes of this section, resisting arrest includes, but is not limited to, flight from a law
19	enforcement when: (1) there is an application of physical force by the officer, or (2) the officer
20	communicates to the person that he is under arrest, and (i) the officer has the immediate ability to
21	lawfully place the person under arrest, and (ii) a reasonable person who received such communication
