10 11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That § 46.2-1025 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 46.2-1025. Flashing amber, purple, or green warning lights.
13	A. The following vehicles may be equipped with flashing, blinking, or alternating amber warning
14	lights of types approved by the Superintendent:
15	1. Vehicles used for the principal purpose of towing or servicing disabled vehicles;
16	2. Vehicles used in constructing, maintaining, and repairing highways or utilities on or along public
17 18	highways; 3. Vehicles used for the principal purpose of removing hazardous or polluting substances from state
10 19	waters and drainage areas on or along public highways;
20	4. Vehicles used for servicing automatic teller machines, provided the amber lights are not lit while
21	the vehicle is in motion;
22	5. Vehicles used in refuse collection, provided the amber lights are lit only when the vehicles are
23	engaged in refuse collection operations;
24 25	6. Vehicles used by individuals for emergency snow-removal purposes; 7. Hi-rail vehicles, provided the amber lights are lit only when the vehicles are operated on railroad
23 26	rails;
27	8. Fire apparatus, ambulances, and rescue and life-saving vehicles, provided the amber lights are used
28	in addition to lights permitted under § 46.2-1023 and are so mounted or installed as to be visible from
29	behind the vehicle;
30 31	9. Vehicles owned and used by businesses providing security services, provided the amber lights are
31 32	not lit while the vehicle is being operated on a public highway; 10. Vehicles used to collect and deliver the United States mail, provided the amber lights are lit only
33	when the vehicle is actually engaged in such collection or delivery;
34	11. Vehicles used to transport petroleum products, provided the amber light is mounted on the rear
35	of the vehicle and is lit only when the vehicle's back-up lights are lit and its device producing an
36	audible signal when the vehicle is operated in reverse gear, as provided for in § 46.2-1175.1, is in
37 38	operation; 12. Vehicles used by law-enforcement agency personnel in the enforcement of laws governing motor
39	vehicle parking;
40	13. Government-owned law-enforcement vehicles, provided the lights are used for the purpose of
41	giving directional warning to vehicular traffic to move one direction or another and are not lit while the
42	vehicle is being operated on a public highway;
43 44	14. Chase vehicles when used to unload a hot air balloon or used to load a hot air balloon after
44 45	landing, provided the amber lights are not lit while the vehicle is in motion; 15. Vehicles used for farm, agricultural, or horticultural purposes, or any farm tractor;
46	16. Vehicles owned and used by construction companies operating under Virginia contractors
47	licenses;
48	17. Vehicles used to lead or provide escorts for bicycle races authorized by the Department of
49 50	Transportation or the locality in which the race is being conducted;
50 51	18. Vehicles used by radio or television stations for remote broadcasts, provided that the amber lights are not lit while the vehicle is in motion;
51 52	19. Vehicles used by municipal safety officers in the performance of their official duties. For the
53	purpose of this subdivision, "municipal safety officers" means municipal employees responsible for
54	managing municipal safety programs and ensuring municipal compliance with safety and environmental
55 56	regulatory mandates; and
56 57	20. Vehicles used as pace cars, security vehicles, or fire-fighting vehicles by any speedway or motor vehicle race track, provided that the amber lights are not lit while the vehicle is being operated on a
57 58	public highway.

B. Except as otherwise provided in this section, such amber lights shall be lit only when performing 59 60 the functions which qualify them to be equipped with such lights.

61 C. Vehicles used to lead or provide escorts for funeral processions may use either amber warning lights or purple warning lights, but amber warning lights and purple warning lights shall not simultaneously be used on the same vehicle. The Superintendent of State Police shall develop standards 62 63 and specifications for purple lights authorized in this subsection. D. Vehicles used by police, fire-fighting, or rescue personnel as command centers at the scene of 64

65 incidents may be equipped with and use green warning lights. 66
