035110412 **SENATE BILL NO. 959** 1 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE 234567 (Proposed by the Senate Committee on Privileges and Elections on January 21, 2003) (Patron Prior to Substitute—Senator Lambert) A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 24.2-515 and 24.2-544 of the Code of Virginia, relating to presidential primaries. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 8 9 1. That §§ 24.2-515 and 24.2-544 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows: 10 § 24.2-515. Presidential year primaries. Primaries for the nomination of candidates for offices to be voted on at the general election date in 11 12 November shall be held on the second Tuesday in June next preceding such election, except that beginning with the year 2000 2004 and in presidential election years thereafter, primaries to choose 13 among presidential candidates may be held as provided below in Article 7 (§ 24.2-544 et seq.) of this 14 chapter on the last second Tuesday in February. Primaries for the nomination of candidates for offices to 15 be voted on at the general election date in May shall be held on the first Tuesday in March next 16 preceding such election, except that beginning with the year 2000 2004 and in presidential election years 17 thereafter, primaries for the nomination of candidates for offices to be voted on at the general election 18 date in May shall be held as described below in Article 7 of this chapter on the last second Tuesday in 19 20 February. 21 § 24.2-544. Time presidential primaries to be held and completion of duties by officers of election; 22 age qualifications for participation. 23 A. Primaries for the nomination of candidates for the office of President of the United States to be 24 voted on at the November 2000 2004 general election, and the November general election in each 25 presidential election year thereafter, shall be held on the last second Tuesday in February preceding the November general election. Primaries for the nomination of candidates for all offices to be voted on at 26 the May 2000 2004 general election, and the May general election in each presidential election year 27 thereafter, shall be held on the last second Tuesday in February preceding the May general election. 28 29 B. The provisions of this title shall apply to the conduct of presidential year primaries including the 30 time limits applicable to notices and candidate filing deadlines and the closing of registration records before the primary. The State Board shall provide a schedule for the notices and filing deadlines by the 31 32 August 1 prior to the February primary including a campaign finance disclosure report filing schedule 33 adjusted to reflect the difference differences between the June date for other primaries and the February 34 date for the presidential primary, and the March and February primary dates. 35 C. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, any officer of election who serves at 36 any election held on the last second Tuesday in February shall be required to complete his official duties 37 relating to that election whether or not he has been reappointed to serve for the ensuing year. 38 D. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, any person who is otherwise qualified 39 and will be eighteen 18 years of age at the next November general election shall be permitted to register 40 in advance of and also vote in any presidential primary and any other primary or special election held 41 on the same day.
