4. Title Department of Planning and Budget; funding for nonstate agencies.

5. Summary/Purpose:

Provides new procedures for filing and receiving state funding for arts, humanities, and cultural institutions. The bill defines "arts, humanities, and cultural institutions," "direct appropriations for state aid," and "general operations."

6. Fiscal Impact cannot be measured.

7. Budget amendment necessary:

No.

8. Fiscal implications:

Additional cost to the Commission for the Arts and the Virginia Foundation for the Humanities to perform the review function.

9. Specific agency or political subdivisions affected:

Department of Planning and Budget, Commission for the Arts, Virginia Foundation for the Humanities, nonstate agencies.

10. Technical amendment necessary:

Page 2, line 66, strike "with" and insert "in."

11. Other comments:

Establishes a review procedure for nonstate agency applications related to arts, humanities and cultural institutions. The bill (Page 2, lines 70- 72) appears to exclude capital expenditures and nonrecurring expenditures such as equipment. The recommendations of the two review groups are not binding on the Governor or the General Assembly. The bill also requires that applications for historic preservation, heretofore handled by the Department of Historic Resources, must now be submitted to the Department of Planning and Budget. The bill, if enacted, would not apply to nonstate agencies for which appropriations are added by legislative amendment to the introduced Budget Bill.
