TheDepartmentisunabletodeterminethefiscalimpactofthisproposal,duetothelackof exactdatarelatingtothenumberofactiveandretiredmilitarypersonnelinthe Commonwealth.Itmaywellbethatthe numberofactivemilitarypersonnelassignedtothe variousmilitarybasesandfacilitiesinVirginiaexceeds500,000.

TheDepartmentcurrentlyentersapproximately20,000permitsperyearintotheVirginia CriminalInformationNetwork(VCIN)usingtwo 20- hourpart -timepositions.These positionsarepaidfromthe\$5.00feecollectedfortheentryofthisinformation.

Virginiahasapproximately39jurisdictionsthathaveconcealedhandgunpermitordinances, requiringafingerprintbasedcriminalbac kgroundcheck.TheFBIcharges\$24.00foreachof thesechecks.Thepermitfeeisusedtooffsetthiscost.Absentafee,theDepartmentofState Policewillberequiredbeartheburdenofthiscost.
