**4. Title** Vehicle registrations; voluntary contribution - Jamestown commemoration.

**5. Summary/Purpose:** The introduced legislation proposes to amend §46.2-694 of the Code of Virginia to require that any form used in applying for the registration of a vehicle or renewal of any such registration include language permitting the applicant to make a voluntary contribution of two dollars to support a special license plate program and other activities in commemoration of the 400<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Jamestown Settlement in 2007. These provisions would expire on July 1, 2008.

**7. Budget amendment necessary:** No.

**8. Fiscal implications:** The fiscal implications of this legislation are uncertain. The Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) advises that recently the forms were changed to give citizens a clear choice about volunteering the additional registration fee to support the 400<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the establishment of Jamestown. Therefore, the bill simply codifies actions the agency has already taken.

The Department of Motor Vehicles estimates that changing the registration form to include language permitting the applicant to make a voluntary contribution, instead of requiring him to opt out, could result in revenues of up to \$3.5 to \$4.5 million for fiscal year 2004 and beyond.

**11. Other comments:** This bill is identical to HB1585 and HB2137.
