4. Title Abuse and lose; deferred findings.

5. Summary/Purpose: The introduced legislation proposes to amend §§ 16.1 - 278.8 and 16.1 - 278.9 of the Code of Virginia by repealing the provisions requiring a deferred finding in juvenile cases of drunk driving and refusal to submit to blood or breath tests.

8. Fiscal implications: The fiscal impact of this legislation is uncertain.
