4. Title Nonresident hunting fees

5. Summary/Purpose: The bill would increase fees for a nonresident state wide hunting license from \$60 to \$80 and would increase 3-day nonresident hunting licenses from \$30 to \$40.

7. Budget amendment necessary: No, the conference report included an increased appropriation for the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries.

8. Fiscal implications: The fiscal impact is increased revenue from higher fees on non-resident hunting licenses. The revenue estimate assumes there is no buyer resistance to the higher fees. Therefore, the revenues collected may be lower than projected, but there is insufficient data to determine the degree of buyer resistance. The estimate is based on fiscal year 2002 actual licenses purchased (15,546 nonresident hunting and 5,291 three-day licenses).
