Currently, only Department of Emergency Management hazardous materials of ficers are covered under the Line of Duty Act.	
6.	Fiscal impact:DPBcannotestimatethepotentialfiscalimpactassociatedwiththisbill. The LineofDutyActprovidesforpaymentstobeneficiariesofcertaindeceasedpublicsafety officers. If theofficer's deathoccurred while in the line of duty, the ben eficiary is entitled to receive \$75,000. If the officer's death arose out of and in the course of his employment or was within five years from his date of retirement, the beneficiary is entitled to receive \$25,000. Also, under the Act certain disabled pu blicsafety of ficers, their spouses and dependents, and beneficiaries of certain deceased publics afety of ficers are entitled to receive continued health in surance coverage fully paid for by the Common wealth. DPB cannot estimate the number of individuals who would potentially be impacted by this bill. While the bill would cover an additional 79 full -time Department of Emergency Management employees, it also would cover an undetermined number of wage employees, including adjunct personnel and reservists. In addition, the number of local government employees who would be covered under this bill would depend largely on the number and magnitude of any events requiring the performance of emergency management or emergency services duties, which are not defined in the bill.
