	This bill would extend to July 1, 2004, the sunset date (§ 58.1-609.4) retail sales and use tax exemptions for exemptions are scheduled to expire July 1, 2003.

7. Budget amendment necessary: No.

The value of the exemptions extended by this bill is estimated to be \$6.7 million (state: \$5.2 million; local: \$1.5 million) in FY 2004 and \$7.5 million (state: \$5.8 million; local: \$1.7 million) in FY 2005. This bill would not necessitate a budget amendment as the official budget estimates assume the extension of all these expiring exemptions. The administrative costs associated with this bill would be minimal.

### 11. Other comments:

This bill would extend to July 1, 2004, the sunset dates for 31 retail sales and use tax exemptions in the educational group. The exemptions are scheduled to expire July 1, 2003.

Senate Bill 742 would extend to July 1, 2004, the sunset dates for certain retail sales and use tax exemptions for nonprofit organizations in the educational and medical-related groups.
