11. Other comments:

This bill would allow individuals who are due a tax refund to continue to contribute to the Historic Resources Fund through taxable years beginning before January 1, 2009. This Fund assists the Department of Historic Resources in the designation and preservation of historic resources.

Virginia has twenty-three active voluntary contribution check-off provisions. Fourteen are permanent and nine sunset. The following illustrates their status:

Refund Check-Offs In Other States

A survey of check-off contributions of the 40 other states that impose a broad-based income tax on individuals shows that Virginia, with 23 check-offs, offers the most check-offs. The states with the next largest number of check-offs are Oregon, which has 17, and California, which has 11. The average number of check-offs per state is 5.

Other Legislation

House Bill 1635 would create individual income tax check-offs for voluntary contributions to the Virginia Federation of Humane Societies, the Tuition Assistance Grant Fund, and the Spay and Neuter Fund.

House Bill 1818 would create a check-off for the Virginia Clean Election Fund.

Senate Bill 1096 would create a check-off for the Art Museum of Western Virginia.
