The Joint Commission on Health Care (which has 16 members, all legislators) meets about eight times annually, for an estimated annual cost of \$34,640 in perdiem payments, travel & lodging, and meals. The Joint Commission on Behavioral Health Care (which has 8

legislativemembersandtwocitizenmembers)mettwicethispastyear,foracosto \$5,300.Combined,thetwocommissionscostabout\$39,940ayear.

With the addition of two more legislative members, as the bill requires, expenses of the Joint Commission on Health Care are estimated at about \$38,000 ayear (assuming it meets eight times ayear). This represents a saving sof \$1,940 over the costs of the two separate commissions.
