4. **Title** Enterprise zones; expiration dates

5. **Summary/Purpose:** The bill provides that if the expiration date of a state-mandated enterprise zone is scheduled to occur prior to the expiration date of a federal-mandated enterprise zone, the state designation expiration date shall be extended to conform to the expiration date of the federal designation.

6. **NoFiscal Impact:** SEE ITEM 8.

7. **Budget amendment necessary:** No.

8. **Fiscal implications:** The bill would require any state enterprise zone that is also designated a federal-mandated enterprise zone to have the same expiration date as the federal designation. There are only two federally designated enterprise zones in Virginia: Portsmouth/Norfolk and Accomack/Northampton. The bill would have no fiscal impact because the Department of Housing and Community Development currently interprets §59.1-275 of the *Code of Virginia* to already designate the expiration date of state enterprise zones as the same as federal zones. This bill would simply further clarify that interpretation. Therefore, the tax credits and job grants that businesses in those zones currently qualify for would not be impacted.

10. **Technical amendment necessary:** No.

11. **Other comments:** SB 903 is a similar bill introduced by Senator Qualye.
