- **8. Fiscalimplications:** The bill does create a potent ial for some increases in costs due to the added administrative requirements. However, in large part, this bill clarifies practices which are currently used so any such impact due to the administrative requirements of the bill should be minimal.

As previously mentioned, the bill also would give the Board of the program the authority to make awards of up to \$100,000 to the families of infants who die within 180 days of birth. In addition, the bill also would authorize the Board to award amounts for reasonable expenses whether or not a favorable ruling has been made on a claim. While the set wo provisions may have along -term impact on the fund, they are permissive in nature and thus, are controllable by the Board.

One provision of the bill that mayre sultina more immediate impact to the program is the requirement that the program perform a study regarding options for revising the feest ructure. The bill requires the program to report the findings of the study prior to December 1,2003.

Any costs as sociated with this study will be borne by the Virginia Birth - Related Neurological Injury fund
