Summary/Purpose:Providesthatjailersshallkeepaformalwrittenpolicystatingthe criteriaandconditionofearnedcreditinthefacility; clarifiestherateforearninggood conductoreditforprisone rsconvictedofmisdemeanors; and provides that in order for a prisoner towork on certain properties on a voluntary basis (in order to receive credit on his sentence for the work done), orders must be specific for identified individual prisoners. The billalsoprovides that for all offenses committed on or after July 1,2003, any order that does not specifically identify individual prisoners shall be void.

- **8. Fiscali mplications:** The fiscal impact of the legislation is not known. The Virginia CriminalSentencingCommission(VCSC)wasaskedtocompleteananalysistodetermineif thereareanyimpacts. They concluded that the legislation would have no impact on state responsible(prison)bedsbutmayaffectlengthofstaysforcertainjailinmates.Itisexpected that, since the legislation eliminates the provision for good conductored it for in mates sentencedtoserveupto12monthsonafelonycrimecommittedprio rto1995,thisjail populationwouldlosesentencecreditsthatwouldshortentheinmates'stay.TheVCSC statedthatalthoughitispossibleforinmatestorecoverpartoftheeliminatedcreditsthrough othersentencingcreditprograms, it is not known howmuchofthecreditwillberecovered. Finally, assuming none of the lost sentence credits are recovered, the VCSC estimates that thelegislationwouldrequire24jailbedsinFY2004and30jailbedsinFY2005.Itis estimatedthatthestate'sshareo fthecostforthesebedsisapproximately\$278,831inFY04 and\$348,539inFY05.

The Commonwealth pays the localities \$8.00 aday for each misdemean antorotherwise local responsible prisoner heldinajail. It also funds the majority of the jails o perating costs, e.g. correctional officers. The state's share of these costs varies from locality to locality. According to the Compensation Board's most recent Jail Cost Report (FY 2001), the estimated to tal state support for local jails averaged \$31.83 per in mate, per day in FY 2001.
