Summary/Purpose: This bill dedicates five million dollars annually from the state recordation tax to the Public Beach Maintenance and Development Fund for use in a wards matching grant stolocal government stop ay the costs of erosion abatement measures, for the construction or maintenance of public beach -related support structures or facilities, and the creation or restoration of beach lands capes. Up to \$200,000 per year of the money in the Fund could be used to pay the costs of administering the program. Currently, no grant can exceed 30 percent of the money appropriated to the fundion and for the biennium. This bill would allow up to 60 percent of the money in the fundion any fiscal year to be awarded to a locality.

Budgetamendmentnecessary: Yes. The Public Beach Maintenance and Deve lopment Fundintowhich these would be deposited, is a dministered by the Department of Conservation and Recreation. Therefore, the general appropriation in HB30 for Item 380 must be increased by the amount of the transfer.
Fiscalimplications: This billwouldhavenoimpactongeneralfundrevenuesbecausethis proposedlegislationdoesnotaffecttheamountofrecordationtaxescollected,butratherthe allocationofsuchrevenues. This legislation would, however, reduce the amount of discretionary general fundrevenue available for appropriation to state wide programs by \$5 million annually.
