Summary/Purpose:ProvidesthatbeginningJan uary1,2004,nocourtclerkshallpostona court-controlledwebsiteanydocumentthatcontainsthefollowinginformation:(i)anactual signature;(ii)asocialsecuritynumber;(iii)adateofbirthidentifiedwithaparticularperson; (iv)themaidenn ameofaperson'sparentsoastobeidentifiedwithaparticularperson;(v) anyfinancialaccountnumberornumbers;or(vi)thenameandageofanyminorchild.Each suchclerkshallpostnoticethatincludesalistofthedocumentsroutinelypostedon its website.

- **8. Fiscalimplications:** The proposed legislation would have no fiscal impacton state agencies. The proposed legislation could have a fiscal impacton to no circuit court clerks, though, which could impact the Compensation Board.

Thelevelofimpactwoulddependontheactionstakenbytheclerkstomeetthenew mandates. For instance, clerks could decide to take the information off the Internet completely. However, some localities have been able to limit staffing, equipment and office spaceneeds by utilizing the Internet. Fairfax, by taking information off the Internet, would require an off site location with 100 viewing stations (with printers and staff) in order to provide service to those that need access to the data (i.e., title examiners, etc.). Fairfax also noted that the off site location would need extended hours to accommodate users (evening and Saturdays). Fairfax estimated a fiscal impact of \$500,000 annually and a minimum of four additional deputy clerk positions. The Compensation Board reported that the state's share of one fully funded deputy clerk position would cost about \$20,772 per year.

Anotherresponsecouldbetoeliminateth eprohibitedinformationfromthecopyofthe documentstobeposted. Wiseand Scott Counties can illustrate the potential fiscal impact on even a small of fice. Wise County projected a fiscal impact of \$50,000 annually to set technology operations to store two separated ocuments on separate servers and scanning twice a smany documents. Scott County estimated the fiscal impact of the proposed legislation to be \$35,000 plus 2.5 additional deputy clerk positions. The Compensation

Boardreportsthatthe state's share of one fully funded deputy clerk position would cost about \$20,772 per year.

Andanotherresponsecouldbetoestablishasitethatcouldonlybeaccessedbysubscription.

Thisresponsewouldprohibitcitizensfreeaccesstotheirownrec ordsunlesstheywere subscribers. However, this response probably would not require clerkstore move the prohibited information from existing or future documents. It would also probably be self sufficient, since fees could be set at a level as to pay for implementing a subscription service.
